YELLOWSTONE PARK PROVES MECCA FOR HUNDREDS OF AUTOS

Records Will Be Broken This Year, Belief; Many Cars Are Heading West. Yellowstone Park, Wyoming, July 21.—Every section of the country is represented among the automobile parties now entering Yellowstone national park.

The totals in June by entrance were: northern, 1263 cars, carrying 3847 passengers; western, 757 cars, carrying 2234 passengers; eastern, 891 cars carrying 2807 passengers; southern, 67 cars, carrying 222 passengers.

Washington was third in volume of travel, with 203 cars carrying 704 passengers; and Wyoming fourth with 173 cars and 533 passengers.

Oregon sends 73 cars. From Minnesota in June came 131 cars, with 474 people; from Colorado 128 cars with 419 people; from Idaho, 114 cars with 409 people; from Oregon, 73 cars with 207 people; from Wisconsin, 84 cars with 108 people.
