**As the World Wags**

THE COUNTY FAIR draws to a close today. Favored by weather conditions it should be compared with previous exhibitions a success as far as finances go. It was a good little fair, too. But frankness compels the use of the adjective little. It was far too small a fair for a populous and productive county like Lane. There were too few in attendance and too few exhibitors. The exhibits were uniformly excellent but anyone who knows the farms and orchards and herds of Lane county knows that they were not really representative and that in most departments the competition that makes blue ribbons worth while was absent.

ALL THIS can be remedied only when some few men take a year from other interests and do an infinite amount of preliminary work which must amount to almost a home to home canvass of the county. They will need to be also men of nerve who will take a chance on untried and untested methods with the attendant expense. Finally, when they are sure they have the goods to present a great fair, they must advertise. Some such group of men will do all that some of these days. Their reward will be the consciousness of achievement. The public will throw to the fair but the public will never reward them for the public is ungrateful and forgetful in all its hydra heads.

GOVERNOR PIERCE looks to me like a go-getter. I saw and heard him for the first time the other day at the Fair. Those clever gentlemen who are pulling wires to secure his recall are perhaps wise inasmuch as Mr. Pierce possesses those peculiar qualities of earnestness and bluff sincerity which are likely to build up for him a following among the common people of the state which will be extremely troublesome to politicians and the interests which greatly control politicians. Unless they get him now he is likely to be a force in state politics.

THE RECALL is likely to prove a boomerang to those who start it. It will advertise Governor Pierce in precisely the way to make most potent his gift of appeal to the plain common people and is likely to seat him more firmly than ever in the gubernatorial chair with a wave of popular endorsement which will make him even less manageable than ever.

ON HORSEBACK Wednesday Governor Pierce rode through the crowd with the easy swing of a man who had spent long days on the range. He made a picturesque figure full of popular appeal as a man of rugged sincerity with a fighting heart. As a man next to me said, "He looks like a square-shooter." Apparently he is unwittingly spoke for many. A man who can make that appeal is likely to go far in politics before he quits the game.
