

OREGON "UNITE TO FIGHT" SLOGAN IS USED BY GRID MEN

The University's Homecoming slogan, "Unite to fight for Oregon," will be interpreted literally by the varsity football aggregation when it meets the Aggies on Saturday, Nov. 24.

Coch "Shy" Huntington declares that his men have developed more fight during the last week than they have shown at any other time during the season. The heavy schedule for the varsity ended with the Stanford game, and the Oregon gridsters have had plenty of time to recuperate from the early season ordeals. "The best team yet this season," will meet the Aggies, Huntington declares.

A tentative lineup given by the coach placed Wilson or Sinclair at center. Bailey and Shields were named as guards. Campbell and Reed, or possibly Vander Ahe, if he is able to be in the game, will play at tackle. The choice of ends lies between Maize, Reed, Williamson and Zimmerman. Chapman will be at quarter; Terjesen and Sax, halfbacks, and Latham, full. Although Huntington did not say that this would be the lineup in the coming battle, he indicated by his selection of men what might be expected.

In going against the Aggies, the Varsity is meeting a team that has found itself and may prove to be a dangerous aggregation. They will outweigh the men on the varsity by at least ten pounds to the man. For this reason it is likely that Wilson, one of the few men in the 200-pound class on the Webfoot team, may play at center. The lack of weight in the Oregon team may, however, be offset by their speed.

Scrimmage will constitute part of the next two days' workouts and then the squad will taper off until the whistle sends them on their way into one of the hardest battles between the two schools.

WATER PROJECT KILLED

Salem, Ore., Nov. 21.—The Jordan valley irrigation district has no legal existence, according to an opinion written by Justice Rand and handed down by the Oregon supreme court here yesterday. The suit was brought by William Weber, a land owner and taxpayer within the district, to determine whether the project was organized in compliance with the laws regulating the formation of irrigation districts. Attack was made upon the notices of the election, which were held to be insufficient by the supreme court, in that they were published over the signature of the county clerk instead of the petitioners.

The opinion, written by Justice Rand, reverses Judge Dalton Biggs of Malheur county.
