200,000 CHILDREN TO BE MADE HAPPY BY SALVATION ARMY

New York, Dec. 21.—Yuletide cheer costing \$700,000 in the form of 700,000 dinners and toys for 200,000 children will be distributed in the United States Christmas eve by the Salvation Army, it was announced at national headquarters here today.

"The Salvation Army will give away more than ever before this year," it was said at headquarters, basing its program for Christmas charity on the estimated increase in funds collected over last year.

Last year's figures show that 449,825 Christmas dinners were provided for the poor and 179 youngsters made happy with free toys. The cost of the charity was \$301,000 while the amount collected was \$325,000 leaving a deficit of \$24,000 which was made up out of other funds.

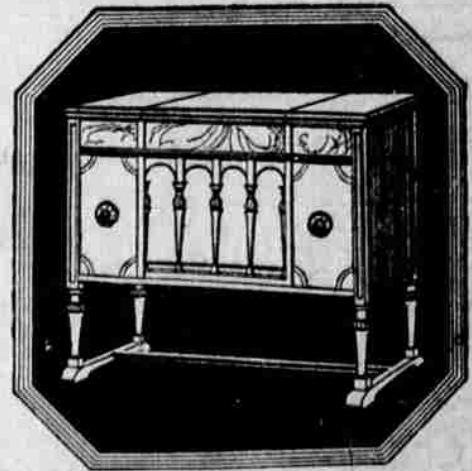
