TICKET-SCALPING IS NOT WORRYING TEX

Sports Editor) New York, Feb. 21.—Faced with the unpleasant probability of a grand jury investigation of his handling of the Dempsey-Furjo fight tickets, Tex Rickard exhibited supreme composure today as he discussed the matter in detail. It is the common opinion that he would be just as unfurried when the investigation is over. Tex Rickard, they say, is entirely too smart to be caught in such a flypaper trap as that in which O'Rourke claims to have found him.

The O'Rourke charges, received by the assembly at Albany, were to the effect that Rickard had had some \$135,000 worth of tickets turned back to him by a local ticket agency after the fight. This, if true, indicated that Rickard had not sold the tickets to the agency, but had sent them in the hope of getting the benefit of an advanced price. In brief the intimation was that Tex Rickard was ticket scalping under cover.

Boxing Men Uphold Tex Rickard himself scents the charges with the statement that, far from scalping at a profit, he intended to sell the tickets in question at a loss.

"They were a block of the \$15 and \$20 tickets which were not selling," he said. "I sent them to the agency to be sold the day of the fight at reduced prices. The ticket agencies were, however, however, a few of the pasteboards were disposed of. Naturally, the rest of them were turned back to me."

Speculating Ordered Stopped. George E. Brower, chairman of the state athletic commission, has made public the fact today that Rickard has been ordered by that body to break up ticket speculation around the Garden, under pain of losing his license.

This, it seems, was the commission's reply to a notice from Rickard that scalpers were plentiful and around the arena at the Berenbach-Walsh fight last Friday. It smacks of a certain amount of official displeasure with Rickard and indicates that O'Rourke may have gone to Albany with official sanction.

It is likely that both O'Rourke and Rickard will be called before the commission tomorrow for further explanations.

IDAHO BASKETEERS AT DISADVANTAGE

On Friday night in the Eugene armory the varsity tossers will meet Borlske's Whitman Missionaries. The contest is expected to be a good lively tilt, but it will not compare in interest with the fray of the following evening. Reinhart is putting his men through a lot of stiff practice this week and is specializing in the defensive department of the game. It was an undeveloped defense that cost the varsity downfall at Moscow, and Reinhart is determined that defeat will not be evident in return game with the Vandals.
