FURTHER DETAILS OF MEMORIAL DAY EVENTS DISCUSSED

Furtherance of plans for the commemoration of Memorial Day in Eugene this year was accomplished at a meeting of the representatives of the various patriotic organizations of the city Tuesday evening in the Chamber of Commerce rooms. A parade which will include all groups of veterans, the national guard and the R. O. T. C., as well as the school children of the city, a dinner for the members of the Grand Army of the Republic and their wives, and programs in honor of the soldiers and sailors, to be held at the Odd Fellows cemetery and the Eighth avenue bridge over the mill race will be features of the day, it was decided.

The proposal for the dinner for the G. A. R. men and their ladies took up a great deal of discussion at the Tuesday evening meeting. Because of the large number of American Legion members, it was understood that the Legionnaires would not be able to attend the dinner, so it was finally decided that it should be an affair for the G. A. R. and their ladies only.

White to Be Marshal. Major William G. White of the Oregon national guard is to act as marshal of the day for the celebration. He will personally supervise the activities of the parade.

School children will be asked to bring flowers to school with them when they return Thursday noon after lunch. The flowers will be gathered up in trucks, and will be taken to the cemetery to be made into wreaths to decorate the soldier graves. The members of the Boy Scouts will help in placing flags on all the soldier graves on Thursday.

A salute to the flag by a member of each organization, who is to be in full uniform, will be a feature. The salute will be made just before the firing of the rifle salute to the flag. Legion Supplies Cars.
