MANLY LIVES LOST IN CHINESE FLOOD

PEKING, China, July 16.—With rainfall averaging two inches daily, the whole of northern Chihli Plain today threatened with a more disastrous flood than devastated that section in 1917.

Two of the railroad lines entering Peking have been flooded out. The cabinet met today to plan relief for four flood-stricken provinces. Officials said no estimate was available as to the loss of life.

IS SECOND RECENTLY IN SAN FRANCISCO, July 16.—The second disastrous flood in two weeks has taken a heavy toll of lives and caused huge crop damage in China, according to cables from the latest flood in the Canton district where hundreds of square miles were said to be inundated by an unprecedented rise of the river in that vicinity.

McKeen, killed by dynamite, bomb exploded beneath his home, the prosecution opened its attack by introducing Fred Estrada, powder man, as a surprise witness, who testified that Craven was carrying sticks of dynamite two days before the murder.
