Prune growers of all Lane county will meet Thursday evening at 7:30 o'clock at the Eugene Chamber of Commerce...

The purpose of the new prune growers' association will be fully explained at the meeting Thursday evening, and definite action will be taken toward the formation of the local exchange, Mr. Miller said.

The North Pacific Cooperative Prune Growers' association has been newly organized for the purpose of handling the Oregon prune crop alone.

At the last meeting of the Oregon Growers' association board of directors, it was voted that if the new association was ready to handle prunes by August 1, the Oregon growers would release their prune grower members so that they could handle their crops through the new organization.

Many of the locals for the new organization have already been formed throughout the state. In order to establish a local, a district must have at least five members, and a half million pounds of prunes must be represented.

DR. SPAETH THINKS BAN ON LANGUAGES IN SCHOOL HARMFUL

Contending against the futility of basing nationality of political allegiances entirely on a language basis, Dr. J. Duncan Spaeth, professor of English at Princeton, at the same time insisted in an address before the Presbyterian synod of Oregon today, that all American children be taught the English language in the schools.

"I should equally resist, however," he said, "any legislation forbidding the teaching of any other language than English in the schools. English is taught in the schools. Effort at suppression associates with the foreign language a sense of political allegiance that would not be inherent in the language at all." The speaker cited in this connection the mistaken German conception which had attempted suppression of the French language in Alsace.

Dr. Spaeth was discussing the influence of race, cultural heritage and environment in developing types of civilization. "One effect of our participation in the World war," he said, "was to bring us closer together as Americans and at the same time to bring us, as Americans, closer to Europe. It has at once stimulated our national consciousness, and our international consciousness. The stimulus to our national consciousness he characterized as a stimulus to power, and the stimulus to international conscience he denominated as a stimulus to service. "Power without service," he said, "is nullity; service without power is futility."

Commenting on the attitude of Americans toward internationalism he placed on one side the extreme anti-national internationalists and on the other side the anti-national internationalists, and placed the great body of the citizenry between the two. "On the one side," said Dr. Spaeth, "we have the Industrial Workers of the World, and on the other, the Industrial Owners of the World." The strife between them, as viewed by the I. W. W., he said, did away with the national red, white and blue, and ranged the reds on one side, the whites on the other, and everything is "blue."

TO ASK DEATH OF LOEB AND LEOPOLD

(Continued from page one) compact mass about entrances. Cameras were everywhere when court opened and Judge Caverly started proceedings with a warning that all in court, except attorneys must be seated and that while time exposures might be taken as photographers displayed, flashlights would not be tolerated.

Many Pictures Made. Then he called the case and the defendants were brought in to the accompaniment of a clicking of cameras. Attorney Darrow started his address to the court in a low voice, which scarcely carried 20 feet. At the outset he assured the court that the defense had never entertained the idea of "restoring the defendants to society."

He told the court that he and his associate, Benjamin Bachrach, had taken fully into account, not only their duties to their clients but also the feelings of the three families involved in the "wicked, unmanly and terrible crime" and the wide publicity interest in it.

No Change of Venue. He disclaimed any intention to ask for a change of venue, pointed out that a long time would be consumed in selecting a jury and said that they recognized that little good might be accomplished by making the dilatory motions usual in such cases.

"We know the story substantially as published in the newspapers," he said, "and we have no interest except to see that these youths are safely incarcerated for the rest of their lives and therefore we withdraw their plea of not guilty and enter one of guilty."

Defendants Morbid. The defendants returned to the cells laughing and talking light heartedly but apparently refraining from all discussion of their own case. They made the light of the suggestion that they had been nervous during the proceedings but admitted they were "glad the first day was over."

They manifested great interest in what the newspapers would print and pressed their guards for all editions. "The proclamation of an armistice got a six-inch headline," said Loeb, laughing heartily.

"Ask about anything but ourselves," Loeb said later in reply to inquiries from newspapermen.

Then the pair turned upon the reporters with an avalanche of questions about details of their stories.

"How many people were outside the building?" the pair asked almost in unison.

"If we were all over the front page," Loeb said. Then he added impatiently, "I wish they'd bring the papers up."

Jacob Franks On Scene. Late this afternoon Jacob Franks, wealthy and retired father of the boy victim of the defendants, called for a personal audience with State's Attorney Crowe.

He hoped today's proceedings would not result in an insanity trial by a commission or a jury, he told newspapermen.

The only purpose of his visit, he told inquirers, was to ascertain "what the day's proceedings" really meant.

"If ever there was a case demanding the death penalty, this is one," the parent of the slain boy said after his conference with the prosecutor.

"We shall go ahead with all our evidence and shall demand the death penalty for both Leopold and Loeb," State Attorney Crowe reiterated late today, after a long conference with his aides and alienists employed by the state.
