TORNADO TOLL IS REPORTED IN SOUTH DAKOTA

Every Building in Yale Is Reported Down; Two Killed at Haiti, Say Reports; Many Injured.
HURON, S. D., Aug. 21.—Reports received here today say a tornado struck through a district 15 miles east of here, killing one man at Yale, northeast of Huron, and injuring several persons in the towns of Ironopolis and Carver. Yale, according to these unconfirmed reports, was virtually wiped out.
