

MEDLEY TELLS HIS FIRM STAND TAKEN TO AID LIQUOR LAW

A large number of enthusiastic democrats met in Eugene Monday and while the meeting was somewhat informal, they canvassed the local political situation thoroughly and mapped out a comprehensive campaign for the several county candidates, several of whom attended the meeting.

John S. Medley, candidate for the office of district attorney, was one of the principal speakers and outlined to the gathering his itinerary during the remainder of the campaign, which will take him to the western portion of the county, as well as to Oakridge, Wendling, Marcola and other sections.

Mr. Medley, in his statement, among other things said: "It shall be my purpose to conduct this campaign upon a platform of justice and fairness and in such manner that I will have no regrets and be able to command the respect of all loyal law-abiding citizens."

Enforcement Is Topic

"If elected it shall be my purpose to rigidly enforce all the criminal laws of the state, including the prohibition law," he said. "Prohibition has become the fixed policy of the state and I am a firm believer in its principles, and believe not only in the enforcement of the law but in obeying the law."

"I believe that a public office is a public trust and that an officer should render a strict account of his stewardship as such, as well as of his personal conduct and behavior."

"Lane county is entitled to the best service available in the office of district attorney and the voters of Lane county should exercise a sound discretion in choosing a candidate for this office, to the end that no mistakes be made and consequent expense be avoided."

Equality Is Stated

"I believe that all men stand equal before the law and that it should be enforced without reference as to the persons who are or who may be their peculiar stations in life."

"I have practiced law in this county 20 years and feel that I am fairly well equipped to discharge every duty of the office."

"The election of a district attorney means more to the voters and taxpayers of the county than it does to any particular candidate or political party."

"The paramount question to be determined is, who can render the county the best service. Politics are of little consequence in the selection of a district attorney, since, after the election, the individual elected and not the political party will conduct the affairs of the office."

"I believe in strict economy and shall, as far as is consistent with rigid law enforcement, avoid all unnecessary expense to the county," Mr. Medley concluded.

The return sheet received today shows that the local creamery made a score of 92.5. There were 103 entries from nine states and British Columbia. Eugene won 14th position in all this array of butter-submitting territory.

British Columbia made first place, with three entries, gaining a percentage of 92.65, while Oregon was second, with 24 entrants, making an average score of 90.83.

"Eugene's individual tabulation of 92.5," points out Mr. Boney, "which places it almost as high as the winning entrants, lacking only .15 of one per cent of that figure, which shows that its high average greatly boosted the whole Oregon score. It was about Oregon's average, 1.67 per cent to be exact."

By states, British Columbia was first; Oregon second, Utah third, and California fourth.

"This contest is conducted every so often," Mr. Boney explained, "and a pound of butter is requested, then analyzed and scored, so we can tell how we all stand in butter-making. Our product received reassuring comment."

DISTRICTS TO VOTE ON SPECIAL LEVIES

Five more road districts will hold special election Saturday, November 1, to vote on proposed tax levies, according to the county court. A total of 13 districts have already been granted authority to hold the elections.

The following districts were reported today by the court:

District 28, proposed tax of five mills for road improvement. Polling place Grange hall.

District 19, tax of five mills for maintenance of existing roads and construction of new roads. Polling place, old school house at Oakridge.

District 4, tax of 10 mills. Three mills for grading and graveling road B starting at east end of road B. Seven mills for rocking road H and grading road A from west end of road H. Polling place, Haselton school house.

District 33, tax of 10 mills for road improvement on 344 west. Polling place, Shannon hall.

District 71, tax of 10 mills for road improvement. Polling place, Chickahominy school.
