PORTLAND MARKETS

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 28.—A two
cent decline in the local butter mar-
ket brought the price down to the
40¢ level this morning while the
buying price of butterfat sagged to
the 35¢ basis. F. O. B. shipper's
track. The declines are expected to
stimulate the movement of butter and
help materially in improving the stag-
nant situation that has existed here
for some time.

There is plenty of butter through-
out the country and increased con-
sumption is the only hope of prevent-
ing a downward trend in the market.
Cane prices were also posted lower
on the local dairy exchange with ex-
tra now listed at 37¢, standard 36¢,
prime first 35¢ and first 34¢.

Other corn markets are in a weak
condition with values gradually work-
ing lower.
