

ASSOCIATED PRESS HEAD SPEAKS FOR CHURCH PUBLICITY

CHICAGO, Oct. 29.—Cooperation between churchmen and those news-people which endeavor to make their better places in which to live, is the message of the Associated Press in a letter to the Chicago church federation before the conference on church publicity, which opened here today. The letter, addressed to the Rev. J. B. Smith, who read it, said: "I regret that I shall be unable to attend and address the church federation. I am very much interested in it and its program of publicity. The churchmen generally help in the work of the Associated Press by reporting their local editors, and the news agencies. You will be interested in knowing that newspapers are publishing more church news than formerly."

ALBERT LOEB DIES AT CHICAGO HOME

CHICAGO, Oct. 29.—Albert Henry Loeb, first vice-president of Sears, Roebuck and company, father of Richard Loeb, co-murderer with Nathan Leopold of Robert Franks, died at his home here after a long illness. Members of the family and physicians said his death was not hastened by the trial and conviction of his son, now serving a life sentence in Joliet penitentiary. Whether the son would attend the funeral was considered doubtful, for, although the prison authorities always permit prisoners to attend funerals of near relatives, the crowds of curious that would gather made it likely no application for a permit would be made. Mr. Loeb last saw his son May 29, when he was arrested at the Loeb home. The father was stricken May 18, three days before the murder. During the trial Mr. Loeb was taken to the family's summer home at Charlevoix, Mich., where he remained until a fortnight ago. Mr. Loeb began his connection with the mail order firm in 1901 as secretary and later became vice-president and treasurer. He was credited with devising many of the intricate systems now in general use in the business where orders were classified, filled and dispatched in a minimum of time. He was 56 years old and was born in Rockford, Ill. He taught in a school and was admitted to the bar in 1890 but practiced only a few weeks. His widow, four sons and three daughters survive him.

Attack By Moose Is Told By Hunter

DAWSON, Y. T., Oct. 29.—Chris Olson, hunter and trapper of Indian river, told on returning here of being attacked recently by an unmoosted moose, considered a rare occurrence by hunters. As a bull moose charged him from green timber Olson said he took a flying shot and hit the animal in the head. The moose continued his charge, hurled him to the ground and gored him in the thigh, hand and head. Olson said that when he thought he would be killed, the moose fell over dead. Olson declared he picked up his gun as a second moose charged him. The trapper asserted the second was killed ten feet from him. Olson expressed the opinion that the two animals had challenged each other to battle and that he had chanced to pass between them as they drew together.

CHAIRMAN BUTLER ISSUES STATEMENT

CHICAGO, Oct. 29.—Chairman William M. Butler of the republican national committee has issued the following statement: "Eight days from now the American people will elect a president of the United States. Our faith is based upon the fundamental desire of everyone for prosperous times. The United States has already entered upon a prosperous period. Calvin Coolidge, more than any other one man in the world, has contributed to that condition. His policies of economy, tax reduction, opening of foreign markets, all have played a part."

Flaming Circle officials have announced they will parade without a permit.

14,412 DEATHS IN STATES CAUSED BY MOTOR ACCIDENTS

WASHINGTON, Oct. 29.—A total of 14,412 deaths from accidents during 1923 caused by automobiles and other motor vehicles excluding motorcycles is shown in statistics assembled by the census bureau covering the death registration area of the United States which contained 87.6 per cent of the total population. This total represents a death rate of 14.9 per 100,000 people compared with 12.5 in 1922; 11.5 in 1921, and 10.4 in 1920. California topped the list with a rate of 32.3 deaths per 100,000 population and Wyoming was second, with a rate of 24.1. Among 68 cities for which statistics were gathered, Camden, N. J., led with a rate of 35.4 and Scranton, Pa., second with 29.2. The state in which the death rate from motor accidents was lowest was Mississippi where the number per 100,000 was 4.4. Kentucky had the next best record, 6.7. Among cities where an estimate was made, New Bedford, Mass., was lowest with a rate of 6.2 and Fort Worth, Texas, ranked next with 6.3. Figures by states with the total number of killed and the rate per 100,000 include: Idaho 11, and 50.08; Oregon 120 and 14.9; Washington 240 and 16.7. In the 68 cities listed there was a total of 5,018 deaths. The number killed and rate per 100,000 in these cities includes: Portland, Oregon, 30 and 14.3; Seattle 55, rate per 100,000 not computed; Spokane, 15, rate per 100,000 not computed.

Deepest Place Yet Located in Ocean Is Off Jap Coast

WASHINGTON, Oct. 29.—The deepest place yet located in an ocean has just been sounded in the Pacific 50 miles off the Japanese coast. It was announced today by the geological survey that a Japanese man of war the Manchuk, made the soundings to a depth of 32,644 feet, or more than 6 1/4 miles without touching bottom. How much deeper the ocean bed lies there could not be determined, because the sounding wire carried by the ship was not long enough. The great depth previously recorded was off the coast of Mindanao, Philippine Islands, which bottom was reached at 32,113 feet.

DEMOCRATIC FARM PROGRAM OUTLINED BY JOHN W. DAVIS

NEW YORK, Oct. 29.—(P)—In his second statement, outlining campaign issues, John W. Davis, democratic candidate for president, declared today that unrest on the part of the nation's farmers will continue until their voice is listened to at the White House and in congress with the same attention given the voice of the banker and industrialist. The policy of the democratic party, Mr. Davis said, "is to readjust the balance and to put agriculture where it belongs—on an equality with industry." Mr. Davis asserted that all the republican party has to offer to the farmer is a promise to call a commission and investigate him again, while the democratic party on the other hand, "has a definite program by means of which it expects to restore to the farmer the economic equality of which he has been unjustly deprived."

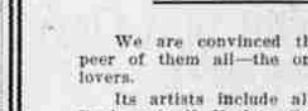

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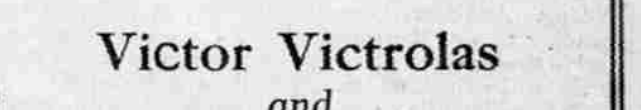
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
