### QUARREL RESULTS IN ONE FATALITY

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 21.—August Fiedler, 22, shot and possibly fatally wounded his wife and killed himself in their home at 816 Albina street this afternoon, according to police reports. A quarrel, growing out of a divorce suit was said to have been the cause. Mrs. Fiedler has a slight chance to live, according to hospital attendants.

Three shots were fired. One went wild. Another struck her in the ear and ranged to the back of her head. The third went through Fiedler's forehead.

Papers in a divorce suit, ordering Fiedler to keep away from the house were served on Fiedler yesterday. He refused to obey them, however, and went to the house. Mrs. Fiedler was afraid to send him away. He stayed there all night and until the tragedy took place today.

### WATER REPORTED ACROSS HIGHWAY

High water resulting from today's rain has flooded the pavement on the Pacific highway between Eugene and Junction City, it was unofficially reported this afternoon. Unless tonight's rainfall is heavy and prolonged it will not affect the road for travel tomorrow to Corvallis for the big game, however.

The country between Eugene and Junction City, however, is thoroughly water-soaked, and a prolonged downpour would put the water across the road, according to residents in that vicinity.

The Amazon slough in Eugene was steadily rising this afternoon, and was within a few inches of flooding its banks.

### MYTHICAL STAGE OFFICIAL JAILED

J. L. Ferguson—the man who predicted a \$195,000 passenger bus on the Pacific highway, posing as a Pickwick stage official—is in jail in Portland on a charge of passing two bogus checks, totaling \$45.

A bankbook was found on him showing a balance of \$100,000, a deposit of \$5,000,000, and \$20 checked out. To create confidence in himself he hired two young men from Grants Pass, paid their expenses to Portland, and showed them a telegram from the Osage Indian agent in Oklahoma, stating he was upright, and that his quarterly income from the government was \$25,000. It represented him to be a full-blooded Osage Indian.

The "millionaire" is still in jail in Portland, and his employees are being held as witnesses.

### PLAN DRIVE FOR FARM HOME FUNDS

Plans for the campaign to raise funds here for the erection of a Lane county cottage at the W. C. T. U. children's home at Corvallis will be taken up at a meeting of the various committees in charge of the work to be held at the rooms of the Eugene chamber of commerce this evening.

The original goal of \$40,000 has been reduced to \$25,000 as the plan for the erection of a gymnasium at this time has been held in abeyance, it is announced.

The need of the cottage at Corvallis for children is keenly felt and those who have given generous support to the campaign here are of the opinion that when the facts are made clear that there will be no difficulty in raising the amount needed for this purpose.

A county-wide appeal for funds will soon be made and active efforts made to complete the goal, it is announced.

### ROAD DISTRICT 60 TO VOTE ON LEVY

An 8 mill special road tax levy will be voted upon tomorrow by freeholders in road district No. 60, which includes College Crest, Chula Vista park, and other territory west of Eugene.

Balloting will take place at 2 o'clock in the afternoon at the community club house. A heavy vote is expected, as there has been considerable "electrotingering," both for and against the proposed levy.

### Drainage District On Assessors Roll

Lane county is about to have its first drainage district on the assessment rolls, according to Ben F. Keener, county assessor. This district which was organized this year comprises 2139 acres near Junction City and is known as the J. D. Cox district. The directors are B. A. Washburne, J. D. Cox and Paul Borgard. No other drainage district has yet been placed on the assessment books and there is no provision in the way of separate columns for this, Mr. Keener stated. The assessment data on the district will be carried separately for the time being.



### National Grange Opposed to Child Labor Amendment

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Nov. 21.—By an overwhelming vote the National Grange today put itself squarely on record against the child labor amendment to the federal constitution. The organization pledged its most vigorous efforts to prevent ratification of the amendment.

This decision was reached after a long discussion and was supported by the votes of every state in the body except Washington, Oregon and Missouri. The convention will meet next year at Sacramento, Cal.

Other resolutions adopted by the Grange favored a non-partisan ballot for municipal elections; opposed reduction in the tariff rates on agricultural products, and endorsed federal farm loan system.

### Attack on Chinese Breaks Out Again

MANILA, Nov. 21.—(AP)—Attacks upon Chinese in the Philippine Islands, which were thought to have subsided since outbreaks by Filipinos about three weeks ago, were renewed yesterday at Laog, capital of Ilocos Norte province, according to telegrams received here by the Chinese consul general.

One message says a Filipino mob broke into Chinese stores at Laog and destroyed considerable property. The government bureau has issued an order to the regional constabulary to protect Laog Chinese from further attacks.

### Portlander Joins Eugene Auto Firm

W. H. Beidler, formerly wholesale representative for the Willa Overland Pacific company of Portland, has purchased an interest in the West and Son Motor company, and will become general manager of the firm.

### ESTATE ATTACKED

MANILA, Nov. 21.—More than thirty strong Filipino laborers attacked the Mindoro Sugar estate at San Jose Mindoro and attempted to eject the company superintendent and four other employees, according to telegrams received here today from the constabulary.

Instructions have been issued from constabulary headquarters here to the constables at San Jose to arrest and prosecute all persons involved in the disturbance.
