William Anderson Will Be Released On Christmas Eve

OSHSING, N. Y., Nov. 21.—The state board of parole ordered the release on parole from Sing Sing prison on Christmas eve, of William H. Anderson, former state superintendent of the Anti-Saloon league. Anderson will be released three months before the expiration of the minimum sentence imposed upon him after his conviction for third degree forgery last January. Anderson's release is due to the action of the state board of parole, which yesterday reversed a ruling it made a month ago that prisoners must serve at least one year before they may be paroled for good behavior.

Last of Villas, Reported Killed, Holds Conference

MEXICO CITY, Nov. 21.—(AP)—Hipolito Villa, whose trial and execution while enroute to his Camutillo hacienda was recently reported, arrived last night in Chihuahua City to confer with General Arnulfo Gomez, the military commandant, regarding matters connected with his recent submission after months of guerilla warfare, according to a dispatch from General Gomez to the chief of staff. Villa, who is a brother of the late Francisco ("Pancho") Villa, is still desirous of abandoning his revolutionary activities and will soon leave for Chihuahua, where he will be permitted to establish his residence.

Major Zanni Will Wait Until Spring

TOKIO, Nov. 21.—(AP)—Major Pedro Zanni, the Argentine aviator, who was stalled here while attempting an air cruise around the world, today received instructions from a committee in Buenos Aires to remain in Japan until spring and then resume the flight to the United States by the north Pacific route. The Argentine minister of war ordered Major Zanni an offer to send a military attaché to Tokyo to remain with the party. Major Zanni accepted the offer. Major Zanni plans to devote the winter to preparation for a resumption of the flight early in May, 1925. Patrick Murphy, advance agent for Major Zanni and Ensign Volo Beirame, a navigator, have been instructed to remain with Major Zanni.

Anti-Rolling Tanks Are Tested on Sea

STOCKHOLM, Nov. 21.—(AP)—The efficiency of anti-rolling tanks was determined on the last trip of the Hapag liner Albert Ballin from New York to Hamburg, when the ship for the first time encountered rough seas. Scandinavian Shipping News reports that the gyroscopic pendulum indicated a rolling movement of six degrees against the horizon with the tanks in operation. When the anti-rolling device was put out of service, the steamer rolled instantly up to an angle of 16 degrees.

OLD GLORY ON MANOR LONDON, Nov. 21.—(AP)—The board of governors of the Sulgrave Institution has been notified that Francis Truman King, of New York, had set aside 1,500 pounds, the interest from which is intended to provide in perpetuity for the flying of the Stars and Stripes from one of the flag staffs at Sulgrave Manor.

INVESTIGATION OF DEATH TO RE-OPEN DECLARE OFFICERS

WARROAD, Minn., Nov. 21.—Investigation into the death of Mrs. Elsie Wheeler, who was found dead in a cabin in the isolated country of the northwest angle of Minnesota will be reopened, it was declared by county authorities here late yesterday, when an undertaking embalming the body found evidence that indicated possible foul play caused the woman's death. Carl Listing, of Roseau, who was preparing the body for shipment to Kansas, said he discovered a cut about two inches long in the woman's head. Authorities of Lake of the Woods county were notified and declared they would investigate the case further. The woman's death was discovered by her husband and Carl Hagen, with whom the couple were staying in the Hagen cabin, on November 13. Hagen and a friend set out for this place where they notified the authorities. The official accompanied by the two men left on Monday for the cabin. A coroner's jury held the woman came to her death by stumbling on a butcher knife in the kitchen of the cabin.

"Mama Dolls" Give Negro Truck Driver Scare of His Life

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 21.—Moses Washington, negro truck driver, last night hastily deserted his load of long wooden boxes and telephoned police when he heard muffled voices coming from one of the boxes. Officers hurried to the scene and opened the box which Washington insisted contained an either dying or already dead victim of foul play. They found it snugly packed with a consignment of "mama" dolls. Each time the truck bounced over a rut in the road the dolls, their mechanical limbs compressed by the jolt sighed in unison "mama!"

3,000 Barrels of Beer to Be Dumped

CHICAGO, Nov. 21.—Attorneys for the Mutual brewery here today sent a request to Major Percy Owen, federal prohibition director, asking that his agents destroy 3000-barrels of real beer. The attorneys explained it had been made lawful for the purpose of extracting the alcoholic content above one-half of one per cent, but that the "brewery" now has more stock on hand than it needs and does not want the real beer on the premises. Roaring of Atoms Heard By Machine

SCHENECTADY, N. Y., Nov. 21.—The roaring of the atoms in 'Irgm' as they are attracted by the magnet can be heard by means of a device recently perfected in the research laboratory of the General Electric company here. The device indicated that noise; in fact the roaring when the magnet is brought near a piece of iron, plainly can be heard from an ordinary radio loud speaker, according to experimenters and consequently it now will be possible to listen to the effect of a magnet on iron or other material.
