

FARM CENSUS MEN START WORKING ON LANE COUNTY DATA

Ten enumerators started today in the taking of the federal farm census of Lane county and this work is expected to be completed by January 31. Two districts, 32 and 33, in western Lane county are still without enumerators as the men selected for these areas were unable to serve. Other census takers will be named for these positions on the return of Ralph P. Laird, director, who will be back Wednesday after a visit to Coos, Jackson, Josephine and Douglas counties where he is appointing enumerators there.

In answer to numerous inquiries the following statement was made today by Mrs. I. H. Loughery, special agent at the local office:

"In reporting the grain crops harvested for the year 1924, both the acreage and quantity harvested must be reported. The acreage for the different hay crops are to be reported separately, and the total quantity in tons of all hay crops must be given.

"In reporting dairy products sold, there must be reported the total amount of milk produced in 1924 in gallons; butter made on the farm for the year; butterfat sold; cream sold not on a butterfat basis; the quantity to be given in gallons; whole milk sold not on a butterfat basis, in gallons. There also must be reported the number of dozens of eggs produced for the year.

"These are items which perhaps will require some little thought before answering, and it is hoped that the farmers may know before the enumerator calls, what will be required. The post office department was to be supplied with blank forms of schedules for delivery to all farmers en route, in order to facilitate the work. Apparently these have not been delivered in Lane county, so it is hoped the farmers may be reached through this medium."

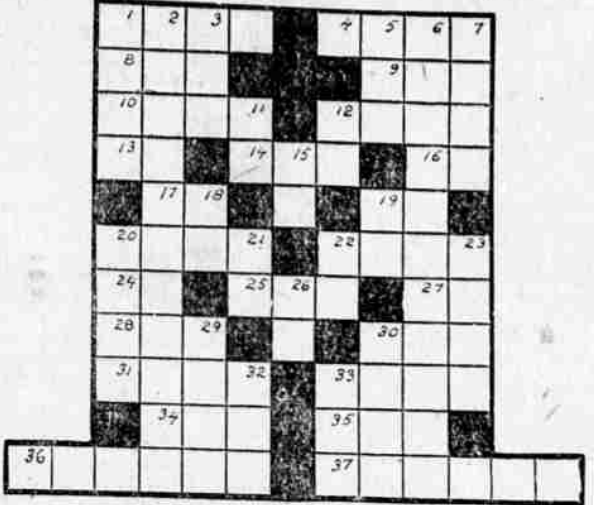

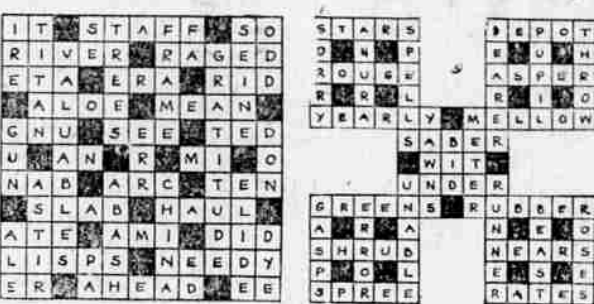
Today's Cross-Word Puzzle

OREGON VETERANS TO DEBATE WITH OXFORD'S TEAM

Three veteran debaters, Paul Patterson, Walter Malcolm, and Joe Frazer, will represent Oregon against the Oxford university team in the international contest to be held in the Methodist church, Wednesday night. Tonight the Oreganians debate with the University of Washington in Seattle. Following the Oregon meeting, they go to Walla Walla to compete against Whitman.

Patterson is a student in the school of law and an assistant in the department of English, teaching extemporaneous speaking. He has represented the University in a number of varsity debates, and last year won the Hilton prize for the best presentation of an argument upon a designated legal subject. His home is in Seattle.

Malcolm, a pre-law student from Portland, debated in the triangular Oregon-O. A. C. college contest last year. His team won unanimously against Reed. Frazer debated on teams that defeated both O. A. C. and the University of British Columbia. Malcolm and Frazer composed the Oregon team last year that defeated California in the first intercollegiate radio debate ever held in the west.
