981,943 SUM ASKED FOR STATE

for 1925 and 1926 approved by the budget committee on agreement \$981,943. This is an increase of \$15,000 for the state for 1925 and 1926, when compared with the actual appropriation of the current biennium, also has approved by the budget committee.

Decreases Are Proposed

The outstanding increases in estimated expenditures for the years 1925 and 1926, as approved by the budget committee, as compared with the actual appropriations for the current biennium, include the state normal school for girls, \$58,358 to \$60,000; state training school for boys, \$100,000 to \$161,675; attorney general, \$125,000 to \$55,780; board of education, \$24,500 to \$30,000; executive council, \$35,000 to \$41,800; and grand jury, \$170,000 to \$190,000.

Many Left Out

The decreases included this state and for the blind, \$88,297 to \$47,000; Oregon state hospital, \$230,000 to \$222,500; board of horticulture, \$22,000 to \$12,000 and legislative assembly, \$120,000 to \$110,000. Institutions, departments and activities for which the budget committee failed to recommend any appropriation for 1925 and 1926 include: on wild animals, public security, state industrial agriculture, operation of flax mill, the values, fish and game commission, bureau of mines and geology, battleship Oregon, Pacific international livestock show, Corn Cobscook fair, Deschutes county fair, Oregon interstate fair, Jackson county fair, Southern Oregon industrial fair, Tillamook county fair, Union stock show and children's fair.

WOOD LUMBER MILL TO RE-OPEN

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 20.—The mill for re-opening the Modoc Lumber Company's mill at Asp Grove, near Mouth Falls, in March or April, was announced here today by V. D. Reed, of the L. B. McNeese Lumber Company, which will operate the Modoc company property. Improvement in the lumber market has encouraged the company to resume operation of the mill, which has been shut down for a year, said Reed.

Home alterations and repairs will be made, but no new construction is planned, said Reed. A new dry shed may be built next year to be ready for use in the mill cuts between 100,000 and 150,000 feet of lumber in ten hours. When it is reopened 250 men will be employed, according to present plans, said Mr. Reed. If the lumber market remained to improve, he added, the double shift may be put on.
