

OREGON MAINTAINS RELATIVE STANDING IN YEAR'S EXPORTS

Oregon maintained its seventeenth place in the relative standing of the states of the Union in merchandise exports for the quarter ended September 30, 1924, when its trade in this direction amounted to \$13,196,684, a drop of \$777,882 from the figures of the previous quarter, according to statistics just released by the department of commerce.

Wheat topped the list of commodities exported with valuations of \$5,478,101. Blank bonds and securities followed, valued at \$1,842,283, and then came timber shipments at \$1,150,470, and flour amounting to \$1,150,247.

The first ten states included in the list, and the amounts of their foreign shipments, are New York, with figures of \$175,900,180; Texas, \$163,265,820; Pennsylvania \$71,834,582; Illinois \$70,755,913; California \$54,574,555; New Jersey \$49,852,174; Louisiana \$46,470,829; Michigan \$39,710,774; Ohio \$31,671,984; and Massachusetts with \$27,762,446. Indiana, runner-up to Oregon, had totals of \$12,870,010.

Grand totals for the first nine months of the year give Oregon export figures of \$46,523,080 and sixteenth place in the entire list of states. Though Minnesota secured eleventh place in relative standing of the states for the third quarter of the year, it ran behind in nine-month figures to the extent of \$1,295,037. Maryland, just topping Oregon for figures of the three-quarters, attained trade to the amount of \$47,160,068.

REV. J. F. HAAS TO LAUNCH CAMPAIGN

Rev. J. Franklin Haas, pastor of the First Methodist church of Eugene, is to take an active part in the campaign for the retired preachers' permanent fund, it was announced today. Rev. The campaign is to raise \$250,000 to place in a permanent fund, the interest to be used for the support of the retired preachers, widows and dependent orphans of the Oregon conference. Laymen will take a prominent part in the work. In the Eugene church there will be five laymen on the committee and broadcasters who will speak at different times before each organization in the church.

PATCHWORK QUILT IS RETURNED FROM UNKNOWN JOURNEY

Interesting experiences are supposed to be restricted to the existence of daring adventures, travelers, authors, poets, yes, even newspaper folk, and all use other great persons.

But if a rare old patchwork quilt, belonging to Mrs. Katherine Chandler, 88 Tenth avenue east, and her daughter, Mrs. Edna McLeroy of Westport, were to talk of their own, we should have the most interesting series of experiences to tell.

Interwoven in the conglomerated mass of gayly colored bits of worsted, casimere, brocade, silks and prints by thousands of tiny hand stitches taken by a grandmother, the quilt was a masterpiece when completed and had woven in its intricate patterns many interesting stories. Concealed carefully within the coverings is a pair of baby mittens.

The quilt was treasured for many years by its two owners, and often served its purpose as a pillow for others. It even had a poem sung about it in a national publication. But last April when Mrs. Chandler was in the hospital and while her household things were being moved, the quilt went on a long adventure. It was supposedly lost, and Mrs. Chandler and her daughter searched for weeks.

Two nights before a recent holiday, Mrs. McLeroy came home to visit her mother. There on the doorstep the same evening they found the quilt had come home, all wrapped up nicely and with the name of Mrs. McLeroy on it. They are now awaiting the return of its companion, a quilt only partially completed which was in the same box.

VETERANS' ACT IS GIVEN WIDE SCOPE

A section in the world war veterans' act of 1924 passed by congress authorizes hospital care for any person who has served in any war or military expedition of the United States since 1807, according to information received today by Miss Grace Norton, secretary of the local Red Cross chapter.

A list of the wars included under this act intentions the following: Spanish American war, April 21, 1898 to April 11, 1899; Philippine insurrection, April 11, 1899 to July 4, 1902, with the exception of hostilities in the Moro province, which terminated June 15, 1903; Boxer rebellion, June 20, 1900 to May 12, 1901; Cuban pacification, October 6, 1906, to April 1, 1909; Nicaragua campaign, August 28, 1902 to November 2, 1923; Vera Cruz expedition, April 21, 1914 to November 26, 1916; Punitive expedition into Mexico, March 10, 1916, to February 5, 1917; World war, April 6, 1917 to July 2, 1921.
