

WORLD'S FEATHER TITLE ANNEXED IN FAST NINE ROUNDS

NEW YORK, Jan. 3.—(AP)—The world's featherweight boxing crown rests on the head of Louis "Kid" Kaplan of Meriden, Conn. "Bazzaw" today as a result of his decisive victory over Danny Kramer, Philadelphia southpaw, in a title match here last night. Kramer was battered into submission by the whirling Kaplan.

The end, in the form of a fluttering towel from Kramer's corner, came after one minute and eleven seconds of fighting in the ninth round, giving the Meriden flash a technical knockout.

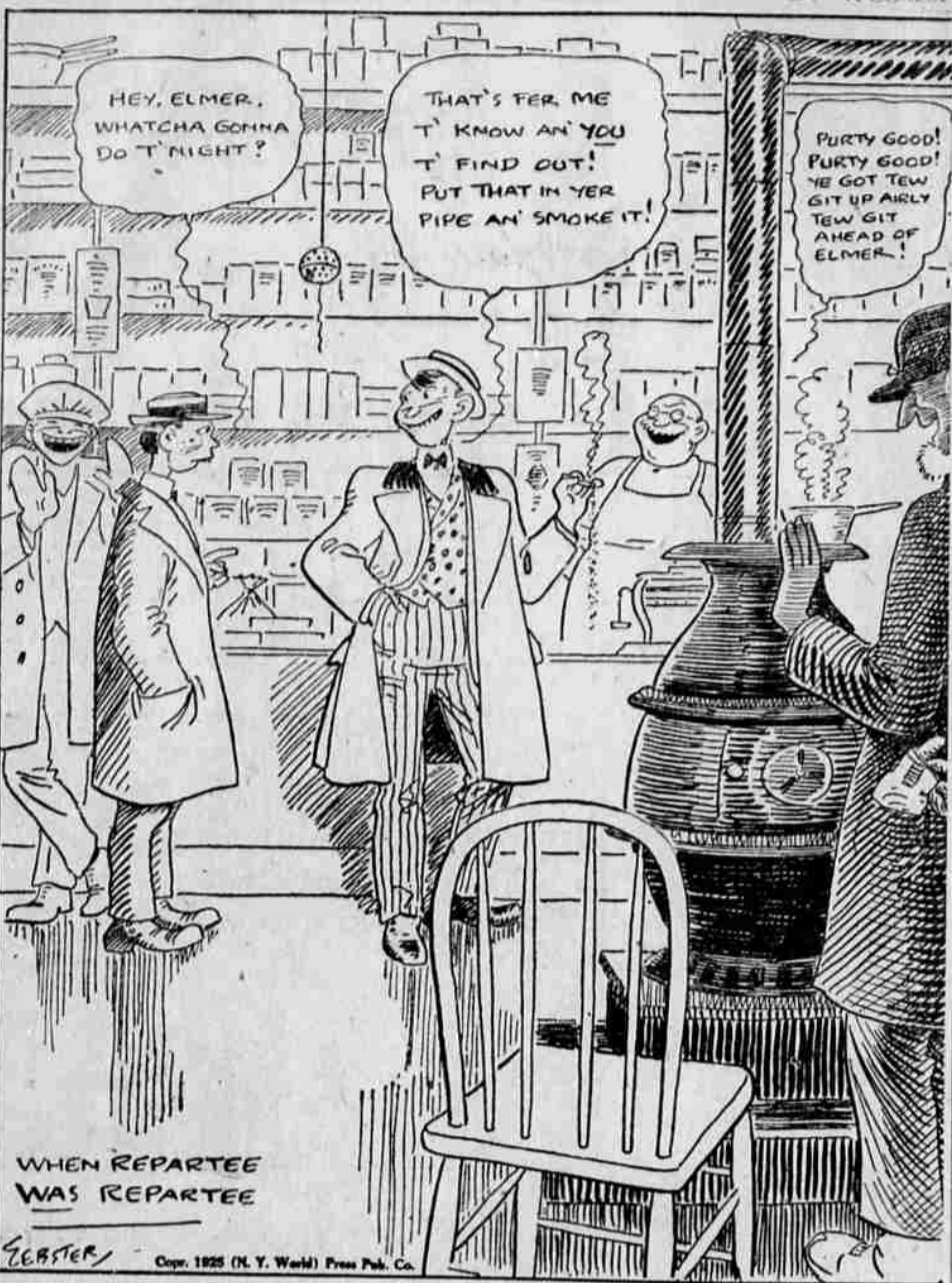

LLOYD J. BEECHER WINS AUTO ESSAY PRIZE IN PORTLAND

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 3.—(Special)—Lloyd J. Beecher, 534 East 14th street, Eugene, is the winner of the first prize in the winter overhauling essay contest conducted by the Portland Automotive Trades association.

Announcement of the \$100 award was made yesterday by the committee of judges which considered approximately 500 essays submitted from all parts of the state. The other prizes are to be announced next week.

The contest which closed December 15, was launched by the trade group to stimulate interest in the value of having the overhauling work done during the slack season of the winter months.

"Overhaul in winter and you won't be tawled in summer. Repair now, and save summer for driving," is the keynote of the winning essay on the subject "How automotive maintenance can be improved by having the car overhauled in winter," which Mr. Beecher submitted.

DISMANTLING OF VALVES DESCRIBED The usual method of dismantling valves which are carried in cages is to compress the spring in a vise and then remove the pin. This method, though satisfactory in a way, is slow. If the amount of such work is sufficient to warrant it, the making of a tool will prove profitable as a complete set of valves can quickly be dismantled with less exertion than by using a vise.

A flat piece of iron is first bent to a U shape. One end is then given a quarter turn and drilled in three or four places so that the head of a screw carried on the end of the lever will pass through. These holes are then filed at the top to a pear or keyhole shape, to allow the body of the screw to pass through easily. This permits the screw to be inserted into the hole, but prevents it from slipping out accidentally. The other end of the U piece is given a quarter turn and then bent over, so that the lever will slide freely between the two parts. A series of holes are then drilled through both

Straightening of Dished Wheel May Be Done With Ease

To straighten a dished wheel of the wood type, loosen the hub bolts and place the wheel on a pair of wooden horses so that they bear against the wood felloe. Fasten a wire staple or eye bolt in the floor in line with the center of the wheel and connect this with a chain to another

eye bolt which passes through the center of the wheel. Place a board or piece of sheet iron over the wheel hub and then draw up on the eye bolt with a nut which will pull the hub down to its proper place. Apply a little white lead to the flange, tighten the hub bolts and the wheel is straightened.—American Automobile Digest.

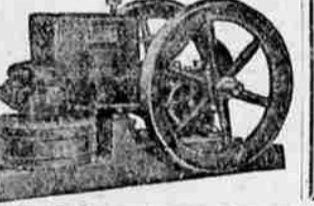

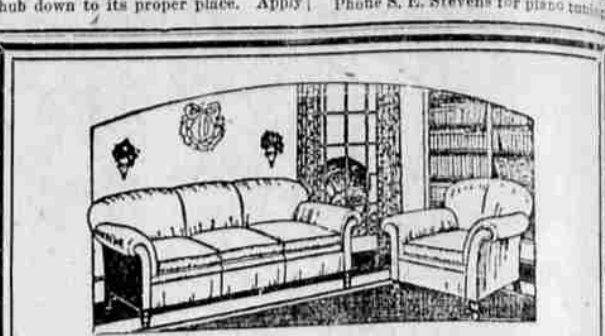

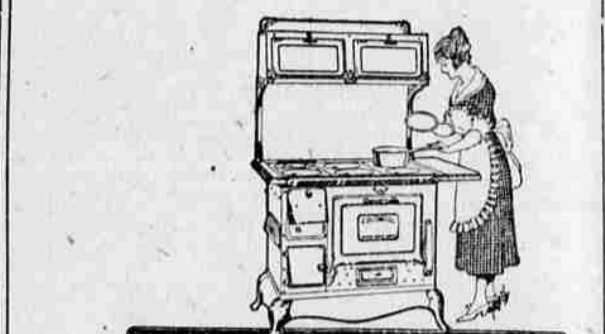
