THREE MEMORIALS HONOR MEMORY OF YOUNG COOLIDGE

MERCERBURG, Pa., Jan. 6.—(AP)—Three memorials to Calvin Coolidge, Jr., son of the president, who died last July, are planned as integral parts of the campus and buildings of Mercerburg Academy.

The memorials will take the form of a new academy chapel; a corner devoted to birds, flowers, and trees in some central part of the campus; and a portrait of young Coolidge to be executed by one of America's best painters.

Mrs. Coolidge has requested that she be permitted to make the cross her gift to the institution in memory of her son.

The school life of Calvin, Jr., was a succession of brilliant achievements. For three years, like his brother John, he kept his name on the honor roll and was entered for matriculation at Amherst.
