

HEAVY EARTH TREMOR FELT NEAR BOSTON

Stove Covers Dislodged By Force Of Quake At Swampscott

Pictures Are Knocked From Walls; Tremor Lasts 30 Seconds

BOSTON, Jan. 7.—(AP)—An earth tremor lasting 15 seconds and of considerable intensity was recorded at 8:07 o'clock this morning at the Harvard seismographical station. Because of some storm or disturbance off shore at the time, it was not possible to estimate the distance of the tremor, officials said, but the direction was believed to be north.

The preliminary tremors by which seismologists estimate the distance of earthquakes were obscured by some unexplained disturbance, it was said. The intensity of the seismograph was attributed to the fact that the tremor was local in character.

Officials said they believed that the direction of the tremor was north by reports from points north of Boston indicating that it was most severely felt there. Gloucester, Marblehead, Salem and other north shore cities and towns reported heavy shocks, lasting from 20 to 30 seconds and accompanied by a rumbling resembling the noise made by a loaded truck on a paved street. In Swampscott stove covers were dislodged and in Nahant pictures were knocked down from walls.

WOMAN PIONEER GOLD SEEKER IS DEAD IN CANADA

TUCSON, Ariz., Jan. 7.—When the body of Miss Nellie Cashman is lowered into its frozen earthen vault in Victoria, B. C., today, the career of a woman who commanded the respect of that rough and ready element that prospected for gold from Arizona to the Arctic regions of Canada and Alaska, will have been finally closed.

While the services are being conducted thousands of Arizona pioneers some of them now millionaires—who knew the plucky adventures of the gold field days will send countless thought waves of affectionate sympathy to the one who has gone.

Friends today recalled the days of 1877 when Miss Cashman first came to Arizona, following the lure of the gold. In the early eighties she grubstaked several of the state's present millionaires on the gamble that they would find a "strike" in Tombstone, Ariz., gold field. Later she used the money returned by these men to finance her long trip to Alaska, where she fitted and "mashed" into the interior—and again it was gold she was seeking.

One of the first of the daring band of women to enter the frozen, uncharted fields of Alaska, she served as nurse at many mining camps, at the same time prospecting and staking her own claims.

It was recalled that only last year when she had reached the allotted age of three score and ten the "champion woman miner of the world," "mashed" her way from Koyukik to Seward, Alaska, a snow trail that stretches over a distance of 750 miles.

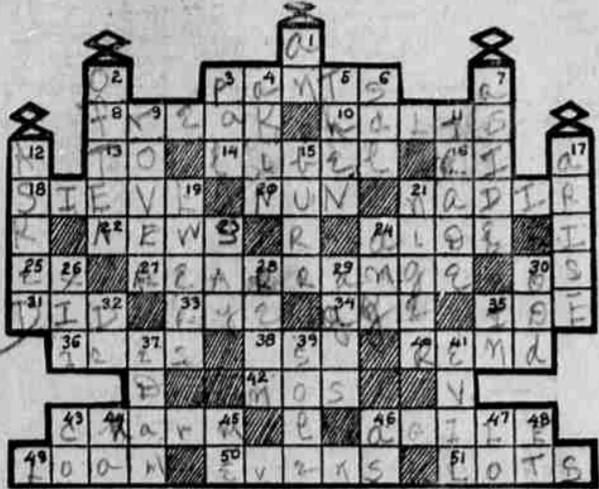

PARTY FORCES CHALLENGED BY SENATOR LADD

Insurgent Republican Senator Questions Leadership Of Regulars

Assault Draws Defense Of Conference Action By Senator Edge

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7.—Senator Ladd of North Dakota, one of the four insurgent republican senators read out of the party councils by the republican senate conference, has thrown down the gauntlet to the regular party forces with a challenge of their leadership and an arraignment of their policies as subversive of the true principles of republicanism. In a sharply phrased and lengthy address in the senate late yesterday, the North Dakota senator assailed the "would-be" leaders of his party as arrogantly setting themselves up as judges of party loyalty. Asserting the "camp followers of the old republican party have become the vanguard of the new republican party," Senator Ladd declared that if to be a republican meant he must subscribe to a party policy of surrender to "financial buccannery" and "tariff magnates," he could not "qualify."
