

RECORD NUMBER IN ENROLLMENTS ARE MADE AT SERVICES

Thirty-two were added to the church on Sunday in the evangelistic meeting now in progress at the First Christian church under the lead of children and Hobgart evangelists. 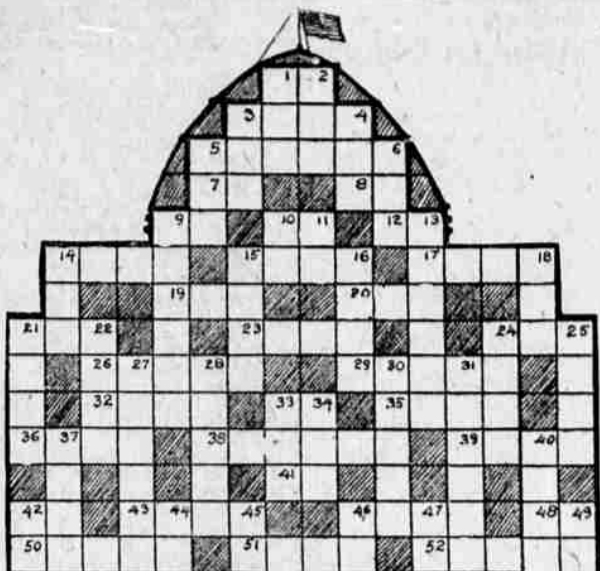

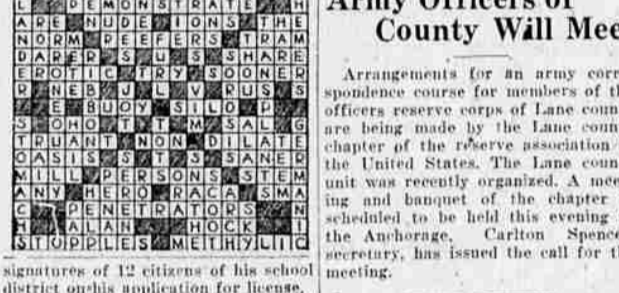
Today's Cross-Word Puzzle
