Blunder, agricultural development agent, Great Northern railway, Omaha, through whom the information comes to us."

Enforcement of the prohibition law in Lane county was discussed this afternoon by Sheriff Frank Taylor at a meeting of the Lane county W. C. T. U. held at the Baptist church. The sheriff told of the record of Lane in the way of convictions during the past year and that this would undoubtedly be repeated in 1925. Sheriff Taylor also voiced the opinion that state enforcement officers should co-operate with the county officials in order for more efficient work instead of acting independently without notice to the sheriff's office.
