CHORAL SOCIETY IS ORGANIZED IN CITY

The Eugene Oratorio society is the name of a new musical club organized in the city for the purpose of presenting a large choral concert every year. George H. McMorrin was chosen president of the organization at its first meeting. Glen Morrow, secretary, and John Stark Evans, director. The first rehearsal will take place at the school of music, University of Oregon, next Monday night.

Membership in the society will be limited to 100 voices for the present. It is announced, although if the vocal material warrants it, the number will be increased. All townspeople and university students, particularly those who have had experience in choral or vocal work, are welcome.

Use of the school of music auditorium and the new concert pipe organ has been offered by Dean John Landbury. The new society will give an opportunity for special training in choral work, and a great number of students of vocal ability who are not on the university glee clubs because of the limited membership of those organizations, according to Professor John Stark Evans, musical director of the University of Oregon.

The new local musical organization which will probably be limited to 100 singers, will present an oratorio in the spring. The organization is open to all residents of the town and university communities who are interested in the production of a large choral concert in Eugene in the spring, who have reasonable vocal ability. Those with some experience in choral work are particularly welcome.
