Benjamin Franklin's Birthday Commemorated In Entire Nation

Today is Benjamin Franklin's birthday, and the beginning of National Thrift week.

On January 17, 1706, in Boston, was born the man who was destined to be not only one of the greatest American statesmen, but the nation's greatest example of thrift.

"Benjamin Franklin, Printer, late Plenipotentiary from the United States of America to the Court of France and President of the State of Pennsylvania," and self-styled a "Shuttlecock of Fortune" in his many-sided life was the incarnation and result of the three guardian spirits of his choice, Ambition, Industry, Thrift.

Lived by Rules

During all his varied career from the day he became a runaway journeyman printer at 17, until he was crowned with honors, Franklin endeavored to live according to his rule of simplicity and simplicity. Said Poor Richard, "It is hard for an empty sack to stand upright."

Oregon Coach Resigns

Joe Maddock Resigns As Football Coach At Oregon

Resignation of Joe Maddock, football coach at the University of Oregon, was announced by university authorities last night.

The Oregon mentor and the coach part with the best of feelings, the only reason for the resignation being that Mr. Maddock did not desire a full year position. When he came to Oregon it was on a one-year contract, and a telegram to university officials yesterday stated that he did not wish to be considered a candidate on the year-round plan.

No steps have been made toward obtaining a successor, Virgil Earl, director of athletics, will be in charge of hunting up a new coach for the

university, and the executive committee, composed of Randall Jones, student body president; Victor Risley, vice-president; Dr. Delbert Stannard of Eugene, alumnus member; Professor H. C. Howe, faculty representative will pass on the recommendation.

Because of the lateness of the season, and the fact that most of the coaches are already signed up for the fall football season, it is considered possible the university may have to fall back on Bart Spellman and Billy Reinhart, line and backfield coaches, or some prominent graduate football player of the institution, to carry them through the season.

APPEAL FOR PARK IN SOUTHWEST OF EUGENE IS VOICED

Believing that Eugene should have another public park in the southwestern part of the city, George Melvin Miller breaks into prose and quotes William Shakespeare and Mrs. Mary Baker Eddy in his appeal for an outdoor playground for the people. The following is the letter of Mr. Miller:

"Now since we have decided to make a city of Eugene we discover the necessity for more parks. As the southwestern section of the city is without any park whatever, naturally that is the section in which the new park should be promoted. A tract of 80 acres adjoining the aviation field on the south, about half of which is covered by nature woods, affords an ideal location. This is the largest tract in tract that has not been subdivided into building sites and thus made available for good park grounds. The north 30 acres of the tract should be added to the aviation field as the present field is entirely too small. The remaining 50 acres is all woods including some of the finest old oaks of the country."

Can It Be Financed?

"Shakespeare said 300 years ago: 'Nothing is good or bad, but thinking makes it so,' and sixty years ago Mrs. Eddy said, 'The devotion of thought to an honest achievement makes the achievement possible.' Here is something for Eugene people without regard to sex, age or previous condition of servitude to think of. One of the secrets of Henry Ford's success is the fact that he had the good judgment to do the things the people wanted done. He discovered the people wanted a good, cheap car so he had the people behind his enterprise."

The success of the New York-Florence highway is largely due to the fact that the people want it. People are thinking of it all along the line making its achievement possible."

"This new park enterprise affords a splendid opportunity for some one or more persons to erect a family monument and perpetuate a name, as did Mr. T. G. Hendricks with Hendricks park."

"When I first secured control of this tract my first thought was to subdivide it for suburban homesites, as many applications for this purpose have been made, but the park idea has a stronger appeal."

"It is now up to the people of Eugene to inspect this property and determine for themselves whether it is wanted for a park. It lies only five minutes walk from College Crest car station and eight minutes drive from the center of the city by way of west Eleventh avenue (paved) and Chambers street (macadamized). With this new park established, the city playgrounds would be well maintained, giving the northern part Skinner Butte park, the southeastern part Hendricks park, and the southwestern part a place yet unnamed."

SHERIFF WHO TOOK BANDIT VISITS HERE

Lloyd Low, ex-sheriff of Klamath county, the man who went into the lava beds south of Klamath this week and brought out Pete Sullivan, charged with murder of Oscar Erickson at Klamath Falls the night of December 31, was a Eugene visitor today on a short stop on his way to Portland.

The term of Sheriff Low, regarded as one of the best of the peace officers of the state, expired the night of January 4 at midnight and the bandit murder was committed a few minutes after that hour.
