**Memorial Is Sent.**—Defeat of the Gooding bill, which would do away with the present long and short haul arrangement of the interstate commerce commission, is urged in letters sent to W. C. Hawley and other Oregon representatives at Washington, D. C., by the Lane county Hoop Lumbermen's club.

**Prune Growers to Meet.**—Members of the Lane County Co-operative Prune Growers' league and the Eugene Fruit Growers' association will hold a joint meeting at the chamber of commerce Tuesday evening, to hear R. H. Kipp of the Portland chamber of commerce marketing department.

**Program for Dads.**—Fathers of pupils of the Lincoln school will be honored at the Parent-Teacher meeting Wednesday night, at which talks are scheduled by Dr. S. M. Kerrou, W. A. Elkins, Dr. W. B. Neal and C. P. Devereaux.

**Returns to California.**—Walter J. Shelley, deputy sheriff of Sutter county, Cal., returned yesterday to his home at Yuba City, after visiting his father, J. M. Shelley of Eugene, for several days.

**Frank Bloomfield Hurt.**—Frank Bloomfield was injured

furnished, or within 40 days after the close of the irrigation season, file with the county clerk a claim containing a true statement of the amount due after deducting all just credits and offsets, the date when the water was first supplied, the name of the owner of the crops and the name of the person to whom the water was furnished.

**Relief Bill Up.**—Indigent widows and minor children of soldiers, sailors, marines and volunteers who served in the Civil war, the Spanish-American war, the Philippine insurrection, and the Indian wars would be entitled to all the relief to which the husbands or fathers are now entitled by a bill introduced today by Senators Dennis and Davis.

Salaries of the justices of the supreme court would be increased from \$2500 to \$7500 by a bill which was introduced today by Senator Stapley. Salaries of district court judges would be increased from three thousand to four thousand dollars a year through a proposed bill brought to Salem by Judge Ashby C. Dickson. The measure with several others prepared on behalf of the State Bar association, Judge Dickson is chairman of the association's committee to draft these measures.

A bill introduced in the house by Fuller of Polk and Linn counties would place salaried peace officers of the state under the operations of the Oregon workmen's compensation act.

**MR. BURGHUFF ACTS.**—STATE HOUSE, SALEM, Ore., Jan. 19.—Legislation to give the state game commission authority to declare closed season in times of emergencies will be sought at the present session. Captain A. E. Burghuff, state game warden, is working on the measure which will be brought up shortly.

The last session of the legislature endeavored to give such power, but the authority placed in the hands of the commission was nullified by court decision which held that the law was too elastic and not specific.

Mr. Burghuff pointed out that many fires might have been averted had the commission been able to declare a closed deer season last fall. He also pointed out that on account of extreme low water, many streams in eastern Oregon should have been closed last summer as a protection and conservation measure.

**INVESTIGATION TO OPEN.**—STATE HOUSE, SALEM, Ore., Jan. 19.—The investigation of the state prohibition department opens with a hearing tonight at which at least five witnesses will be called. These will be George L. Cleaver, state prohibition commissioner; Governor Pierce, W. J. Herwig, superintendent of the State Anti-Saloon league; Joseph Helgeson, of Dallas, president of the District Attorneys association and T. M. Hurlbut of Portland, president of the Sheriff's association of the state.

The hearing tonight may not take any actual testimony from these witnesses, but possibly they will each be given an opportunity to suggest to the committee the lines that should be followed in the probe.

### EFFECT OF IRISH PARTITION IS FELT

DUBLIN, Jan. 19.—The effects of the establishment of the Free State, and of the partition of Ireland into North and South, are beginning to be felt in the professions of law and medicine. Hitherto attorneys have been able to practice in any part of Ireland, but henceforth they will have to choose between Northern and Southern Ireland as a qualification in one does not extend to the other.

Free State physicians have formerly had a place on the British medical register, which gave them a right to practice in Great Britain and the colonies. As many Irish doctors are educated for export this was a valuable right. The Free State is now considering the setting up of a separate Free State medical register, and meanwhile the old arrangement is continued.

It is hoped by legislation both in the Free State and Great Britain to effect an accommodation of the matter about which the medical profession is much concerned.

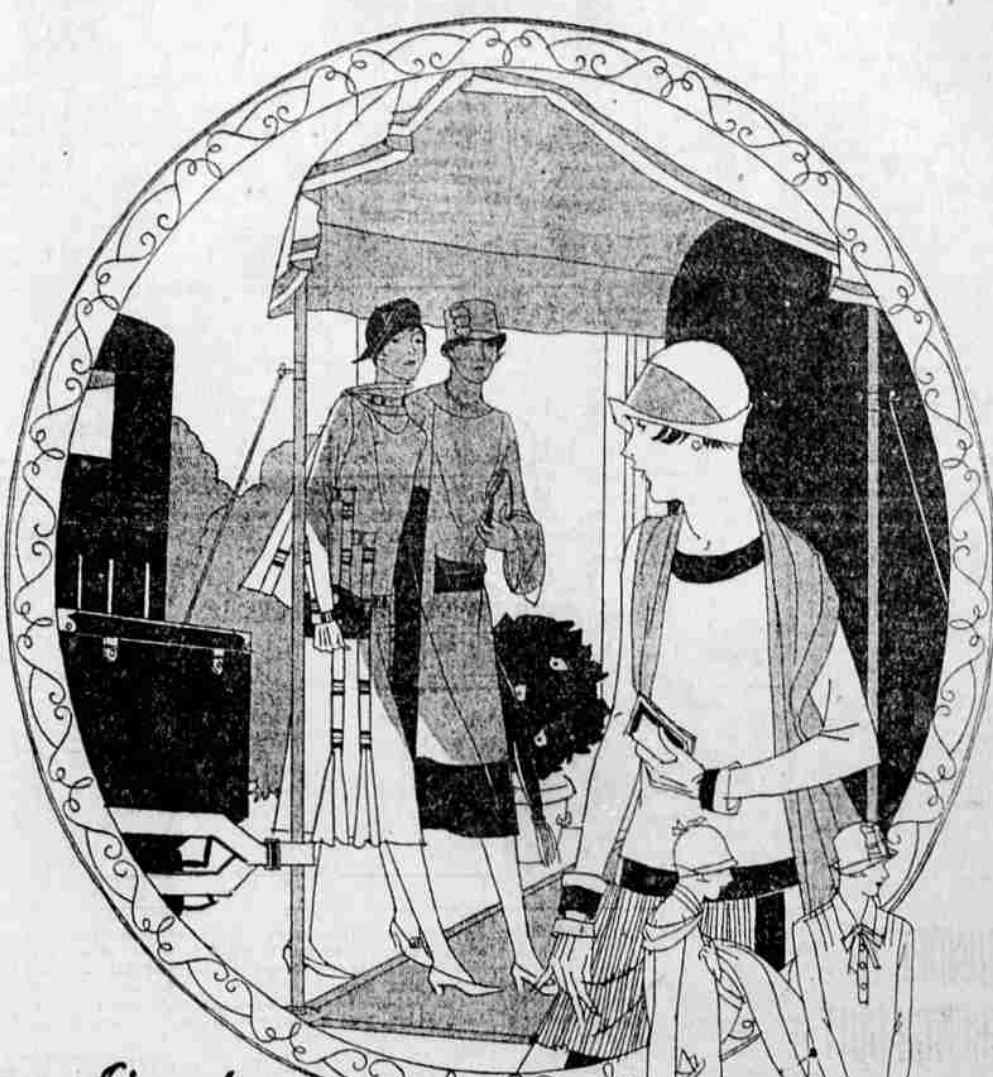
### Cab Driver Halted During Speed Test

Charged with breaking the speed laws, R. D. Wright, driver for the Red Cab taxi company, was cited to appear in court this afternoon by Van Swaverud, chief deputy sheriff. Wright is alleged to have driven by the university and the Patterson school at the rate of over 30 miles an hour and to have reached a speed of 43 miles when coming in on Ninth avenue from the south part of the city. The speed test took place shortly after one o'clock at a time when there were many students crossing the street and also many children near the school, the county officer declares.
