DEMAREST REVIVAL

TO START FEB. 22

SCHOOL BOARD MEN INSPECT SCHOOLS

Mid-year promotions of Eugene school pupils will take place February 9, it is announced in the office of the school board clerk. This date marks the end of the present semester, and the second semester will start February 12.

A total of 3277 students are now enrolled in local schools, according to the report of Joseph T. Glenn, superintendent of schools. This makes \$389 for the school year. The rious classes is 3133 and the average daily attendance is 3018, or a percentage of 97 per cent.

Pupils eligible for promotion February 9, by grades are as follows: Grammar school: first grade, 308; second grade, 281; third grade, 278; fourth grade, 204; fifth grade, 287; sixth grade, 315; seventh grade, 312; eighth grade, 238. High school: ninth grade, 333; tenth grade, 231; eleventh grade, 230; twelfth grade, 219; unclassified 23.
