

### PAVING CONTRACTS TO BE LET TODAY

At 5 o'clock this afternoon, the Eugene city council will let the \$100,000 worth of paving contracts for which sealed bids were opened at the council meeting last night.

The Oregon Contract company of Portland, outbid all of the local firms on six out of the seven paving projects advertised by the city. It was revealed at the meeting.

A petition asking for the paving of Washington street from Sixth avenue north to the end of the street was submitted to the council and was referred to the street committee.

The proposed purchase of a street sweeper for the city was voted down last night by the council, which was equally divided as to the advisability of investing \$6500 in the machine. Mayor Parks cast the deciding vote against the sweeper.

Several of the members, it was understood, voted against the purchase, to allow more time for investigation.

### MUNICIPAL LEAGUE PLANS TO BE TOLD

Mayor E. B. Parks will be the principal speaker at the noon luncheon meeting of the Eugene chamber of commerce Thursday and the municipal chief will explain to Eugeneans the program outlined for the new league of Oregon cities organized last week at Portland.

The organization is sponsoring a legislative program stressing the need for retaining the present "home rule" of municipalities against certain pending legislation. It is announced, as one of the objectives of the league.

Taking over of traffic regulations in the cities by the state department is one proposal that is opposed by the new league and Mayor Parks will explain the stand of the city officials on this.

A musical program for the luncheon will also be prepared, according to announcement today of the chamber officials.
