

# STATE OWNERSHIP OR OPERATION OF UTILITIES RAPPED

STATE HOUSE, SALEM, Ore., Jan. 28.—The legislature would be called upon to go on record against the state going into any scheme of state ownership or operation of public utilities under a resolution introduced in the house this morning by Representative Carlin, Jackson county.

A joint resolution introduced by Representative Collier of Klamath county, proposing a constitutional amendment to allow that county to issue bonds in excess of present constitutional limitations, was adopted by the senate today. The measure is necessary to enable the county to meet outstanding indebtedness.

Representative Fisher's bill, which increases the territory in Douglas county that is closed to livestock running at large was passed by the senate today.

Among six bills passed by the house today was No. 29, by Cowgill of Jackson, repealing the present law requiring the filing of reports with the secretary of state covering the chemical analysis of metals before such materials can be sold to the state or its subdivisions. Cowgill said the present law was designed for the particular benefit of certain convert manufacturers.

Senator Butler's bill increasing the salaries of the Wasco county judge and treasurer, was passed by the senate today. Zimmerman said he voted against the bill because in raising the salary of the judge from \$800 to \$1800 a year it raised the salary 100 per cent. He said he would not object to an increase to \$1000 of \$1200.

Senator Davis' bill relating to non-evidence of ownership of livestock by brands and designated to make it easier to prosecute for larceny of livestock was passed.

The Dunn bill authorizing the board of regents of the state normal school to accept donations was passed.

The Clark bill abolishing the Western normal school and transferring its property to the Western public school district or the city of Weston was passed. The bill was introduced at the request of the board of regents.

# HUGH WINDER HEADS NEW MEN'S CHORUS

Hugh Winder was named permanent chairman of the new men's chorus of Eugene at the organization meeting last night, and a plan made whereby the organization would be formed out of double quartets from the various service clubs of the city, and the chamber of commerce.

The project will be submitted to the clubs for their approval. It is thought the double quartets would provide a solid but flexible organization, and at the same time make the chorus more useful. Under this system, Mr. Winder points out, each of the service clubs will have its own singing club. The membership of the club will be about 50.
