

EUGENE 'Y' TAKES WIDE FIELD IS OFFICER'S BELIEF

Twenty new boys' clubs, comprising a total of 277 boys were organized last year through the activity of W. Walter, head of boys' work at the M. C. A., according to Frank Eberhart, secretary of the Eugene Y. club.

The membership of the 'Y' at the close of the year numbered 233 men and 108 boys—a total of 401 as against 350 at the close of the year last year.

Physical education department enrolled 101 different men, the report shows. 108 boys and 48 women in various classes during the year.

Special work promoted by Mr. Eberhart, examples are the county athletic league of six teams, learn to swim campaign, teaching 40 boys, and 45 women to swim; life-saving instruction to 35 boys; volleyball tournaments and one team in the tournament at Portland.

Mr. Eberhart, who is chairman of the managing board of the week day school, says "nothing more substantial is being conducted in Eugene in religious education than in the city of Portland."

Educational classes are being conducted in drawing, public speaking, English, with a total enrollment of 128. The public speaking class is the best ever conducted, according to the secretary.

The annual canvass was not so successful as the previous year, Mr. Eberhart points out. "It presents a challenge for us for 1925 to reach the best ground and make the most of it."

The new plan of monthly meetings, and a membership committee is being organized. We are expecting to plan to eliminate in October our best membership roundup we have had."

BLIND AND DEAF, BUT SHE'S HAPPY

Helen Keller Doesn't Mourn Fact That She Isn't a Modern Flapper; No Attraction For Her.

Bobbed Hair and Painted Lips Held no Attraction

CLEVELAND, Jan. 29.—If you had never seen a real American flapper, with her bobbed hair, short skirts, rouged cheeks, and painted lips from which a cigaret dangled, what would you think of her?

If you never had heard this same flapper chattering flippantly about many dances, wild auto rides and her many admirers, can you imagine what you would think of her?

There is one prominent American woman, who has lived in this country all her life, and yet never has seen or heard the American flapper—so easily seen and heard.

Has Mind Picture. But in her "mind's eye" she has a picture of the modern American girl and she has very definite opinions regarding her.

"Woman once was the slave of man, but now—she is the slave of flitting pleasure."

Those words sum up what Miss Helen Keller, blind and deaf since she was 19 months old, thinks of the modern girl she has never seen.

The picture this famous blind woman has of the flapper was obtained entirely from her "hand talks" with her teacher, Mrs. Anne Sullivan Macy, who "writes" words on Miss Keller's hand by certain movements of her own hand.

Can't Imagine Bobs. "And bobbed hair and short skirts, I can't imagine that they would make a woman attractive. If I had my sight back, one of the last things I would want to see would be a girl of this type."

"She is only thinking of her own pleasure. She is constantly seeking frivolous happiness, and she never finds real happiness. She just flirts about from one selfish pleasure to another. She is a slave of pleasure."

"Without my sight and hearing, I believe I am happier than she is."

Mrs. Washburne said she got results from Cleaver's department, but not elsewhere.

According to her testimony, Mrs. Washburne was a concealed witness when Abe Weinberg gave the \$100 bill to H. L. Barker, one of Linville's men, in an attempt to trap him.

"I was concealed in a cupboard in the room where the transaction took place," said the witness. "And the couch where the men sat was so arranged that I saw it all."

Weinberg Meets Runners. She told of another purpose for which the cupboard was used. Weinberg posed as a big bonded liquor shipper, she claimed, and the other big dealers would come up to his room where they exchanged all the latest run-running and bootlegging gossip.

"Mr. Weinberg would meet these men in one room. I was hidden in the cabinet in another, while Mrs. Weinberg and one or two others were stationed elsewhere. By the use of a telephone I could hear all of the conversation in Mr. Weinberg's room."

Dr. Linville, said the witness, at one time wanted her to spread propaganda among the women's clubs of Portland for the abolition of the state department.

When she went to work for the Anti-Saloon league, Mrs. Washburne said W. J. Herwig, superintendent of the league, told her his investigation was to cover run-running, big bonded liquor dealers and crooked officials.

Larondo Pierce Chummy. Asked about her acquaintance with Larondo Pierce, Mrs. Washburne said: "I had heard that Larondo Pierce had much information about corrupt officials, so I invited him and Dolly Quarterer up to my house. He got very chummy with me, but my mother was there. He proposed a scheme to blackmail Mr. Cleaver. The scheme was to lure Cleaver to a room, get a woman there by ruse and then he and I were to come in just as the woman had her arms around Cleaver's neck. But I wouldn't enter into a scheme of that kind."

"Pierce wanted to be prohibition commissioner himself," she went on.

Attorney On Stand. Lily Stipp, district attorney of Clackamas county was the first witness of the afternoon. He said that he had always got help from Cleaver's office when he asked for it, but that there had been no co-operation with the sheriff's office. His opinion was that conditions in Clackamas county were such that no sheriff could handle the situation alone.

Willard M. Huston, Cleaver's deputy, testified at some length. He said he had no friction with Sheriff Roberts of Deschutes county. His story of a still in Jefferson county that Roberts wanted him to get was different from Roberts' story as told a few days ago. Roberts claimed no effort was made to get the still. Huston said he went to the acting sheriff of Jefferson county and that he and the sheriff and two other men went to the place mentioned by Roberts, but found neither the man nor the still, though there was evidence that a still had been located there.
