

ANOTHER DECLINE REPORTED IN EGGS

Extras Drop To Loss; Production Increasing As Demand Slumps

Portland, Ore., Jan. 30.—Another sharp decline took place in the local egg market today and the situation is very weak even at the lower levels. On the exchange extras drop to 40c a loss of three cents;...

Production is increasing and supplies are more than the shipping demand on also. A farmer tone is shown in the local butter market with cubes higher for the day on the dairy exchange. Extras are up one half cent at 43-1-2c standards up a cent at 42c and prime firsts a cent and a half higher at 41-1-2c. Prints and butterfat prices are steady and unchanged with resale moderate and demand good on crop stuff. A close check of hops remaining unsold in this state by local dealers shows a total of approximately 10,000. This includes 7800 bales of 1924 crop and 2,200 of old hops. The market is very firm with growers turning down current offers. Last sales made at 17 to 18c.
