PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 9.—Choice veal and hogs are bringing a 16c bid in the local market for country raised meats. Today's receipts were 100 head of hogs and 100 head of veal. There is a lower trend in the egg market with receipts and demand alike. Extras today were 37c on the average lot, offered at 35 on the exchange lot.

The butter market is strong with prices unchanged. High score stock is scarce. Live poultry receipts were light today and the market has a slight underbore. Prices are unchanged.
