

# KLAN CLASHES WITH COLORADO CHURCH

## Two Men Stand Out as Leaders in Conflict; One is Governor C. J. Morley, And Other is Father Matthew Smith

DENVER, Feb. 12.—In klan-ridden Colorado two men stand out as leaders of the divided citizenry. One is Governor C. J. Morley. The other is Father Matthew Smith, priest and editor of a local Catholic paper. They are on opposite sides of the struggle which centers on the avowed program to: Remove Judge B. Lindsey of juvenile court. Abolish parochial schools. Prohibit the use of sacramental wine at church services. Governor Morley wrote the law which has as its purpose the deaconing of sacramental wines, and forbidding a law making attendance at public schools compulsory. "Not Member" Father Smith says he will defy enforcement of any law regulating use of sacramental wines, and will continue defiance "in the face of imprisonment or death itself."

When they have been imprisoned or put to death. Expects to Win It was Father Smith's deft which first focused national attention to Colorado. While his pronouncements are to the point and belligerent, he himself is fully optimistic toward more peaceful settlement of the situation. BEND, Ore., Feb. 12.—Bend high school was eliminated from the state debate contests when it lost to both The Dalles and Hood River in a triangular contest held yesterday afternoon. The Dalles negative team beat the local squad in Bend, while the local affirmative team was defeated at Hood River. The debate at Hood River was judged by only one judge, Harold F. Tuttle, of Pacific University, Forest Grove. Three judges acted at the debate in Bend, where the vote was two to one for The Dalles. The judges here were Rev. Putnam, Holmond; A. F. Isensee, Prineville and H. G. Lake, Tualuma.

HOOD RIVER, Ore., Feb. 12.—In a triangular debate with Bend and The Dalles high schools Tuesday, the Hood River affirmative team, Clifford Emmel and Lois Jean Sinden, defeated the Bend negative, Mary Bennett and Maurice Hoover, by unanimous decision here. The Hood River negative, Roger Woodward and Harriet Fuller, lost at The Dalles by 2 to 1 vote of the judges. The debaters discussed united membership and control of coal mines.

### Appropriations Bill Signed by President

WASHINGTON, Feb. 12.—The final appropriations bill with its request for another arms conference was signed yesterday by President Coolidge. The president affixed his signature without public comment on the conference suggestion. A total of \$287,000,000 is provided by the bill for the naval establishment for the fiscal year beginning next July 1.

### Ferguson Amnesty Bill Opinion Asked

AUSTIN, Texas, Feb. 12.—A resolution calling for an opinion from the state's attorney general on legality of the Ferguson amnesty measure passes Tuesday by the senate unanimously adopted yesterday by the house of representatives. The resolution was introduced by Representative Dinkle of Greenville. The amnesty measure designed to restore civil rights to former Governor James E. Ferguson, who was impeached seven years ago, reached the lower house from the senate yesterday.

### Concordat Between Vatican and Italy's Government Fails

ROME, Feb. 12.—(AP)—All attempts to negotiate a concordat between the Vatican and the Italian government have failed because the Holy See, it is stated in circles close to the government, has made it an initial condition that the concordat be acknowledged by all the powers, thus becoming an international agreement. This would enable any signatory party to interfere in what Italy considers her own internal affair, namely, her relations with the Vatican. The London Morning Post has printed an item stating that Roman Catholic circles in Great Britain understood there was considerable likelihood of a concordat being shortly reached between the pope and Premier Mussolini in which case his holiness proposed to make a tour of the world. It is understood that Premier Mussolini has not lost hope of finding a solution satisfactory to both parties, but nothing positive has resulted. The report reaching here that, once the concordat was concluded, the pope would make a tour of the world, is given no credence.
