When Gibbons finally got a chance against Dempsey he was forced to gamble on the gate. He went the limit, 15 rounds, with the champion but received nothing but glory. Dempsey got all the coin.

He next fought in England against Britain's best. He was to have received \$40,000. The fight was a fizzle financially and he was lucky to get \$15,000.

Always the true sportsman, Gibbons never refused to keep his engagements. Few other fighters would have done the same.

The latest is that he has been matched with Harry Wills for the biggest guarantee ever offered him. So it looks as if being a regular fellow was finally to be rewarded.
