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MULTNOMAH CLUB SWIMMERS COMING

University of Oregon's first swimming meet in the home tank will be held Saturday night with the Multnomah club of Portland, its opponent. The meet, which will be in the Woman's building tank, will start at 7:30 o'clock.

Several weeks ago Multnomah and Oregon met in Portland and the result was a 34 to 34 tie. Multnomah has since faced the Oregon Aggies, and lost by a close margin.

Coach Fahl, who will be in charge, has arranged a program which also will include three women's events. As Multnomah will not send a women's team, the co-ed's scores will not count.

The purpose of having them on the program is to show what they have accomplished this season.

Each team will enter two swimmers. The Oregon team is built around former star swimmers of the Multnomah club, who now are attending college. The visitors are coached by Jack Coyle, under whose tutelage Happy Keuhn, instructor at Oregon Agricultural college, won the world's diving championship in the Olympic games in Belgium in 1920.
