Red Cross Worker Here

Lane county should have a public health nurse, says Miss M. Howells of The Dalles, Red Cross secretary, who was in Eugene yesterday on a business trip. She called at the local office of the Red Cross and discussed administrative problems with Miss Grace Norton, secretary. The county pays almost enough money to the Oregon Tuberculosis society from health seals yearly to entitle it to a share of the money spent in co-operation with Red Cross chapters and county courts, Miss Howells declared. She is a graduate in social work from the University of Oregon, and has been with The Dalles since last summer. Through her efforts from The Dalles chapter Miss Howells obtained a public health nurse, whose salary is financed largely through the Red Cross and funds appropriated by the Tuberculosis society.
