

FORMER PREMIER OF SWEDEN DIES AT AGE OF 63

STOCKHOLM, Feb. 24.—Hjalmar Branting, former premier, died shortly after noon today. He was 63 years of age.

Hjalmar Branting, the first socialist prime minister in the history of Sweden and one of the outstanding public men of that country in his time, was regarded by the Swedish people as their country's most prominent international politician.

Devoting essentially his entire life to the amelioration of the conditions of the working classes and the attainment of the social democratic dream of universal peace by universal understanding, Dr. Branting worked unceasingly and with a fine optimism for the realization of his ideals. He spent himself in personal sacrifice, and set in motion for his championing of the cause of those whose caste and culture were inferior to his own.

Interference with these activities, which he regarded as his more important international work, prominent reason for Dr. Branting's resignation as finance minister in the Eden government in 1918, although he had said he was withdrawing from the cabinet because of the condition of his health.

The ministry from which he resigned fell in 1920 and Dr. Branting succeeded to power, forming an entirely social democratic administration. His government remained in power, however, only from March to October, 1924, because of divergent views between it and parliament on the question of disarmament and for the third time Dr. Branting was called to head the government.

As the representative of the Swedish social democracy, Dr. Branting played an important role in nearly all international labor conferences. During the Paris peace conference, Dr. Branting was active as an advocate of peace on the lines of Woodrow Wilson's fourteen points.

Dr. Branting, with Christian L. Lang of Norway, secretary of the International union, was awarded the Nobel peace prize for 1921.

Born at Stockholm, November 28, 1861, Dr. Branting was the son of Professor L. G. Branting. He was educated at Upsala university, studying natural science.

Another Bermuda Flight Will be Tried by Airship

LAKELAND, N. J., Feb. 24.—Another Bermuda flight will be undertaken by the dirigible Los Angeles probably Wednesday of this week. It was announced by Rear-Admiral W. A. Moffett, chief of the navy's bureau of aeronautics.

Naval officials are desirous of completing the experiment of mooring the ship to the mast of the Panama, airship tender, in Bermuda harbor, he said.

The Los Angeles was prevented by bad weather and limited fuel supply from resting over night at Bermuda harbor, and returned immediately to the hangar. Fuel for only 34 hours had been taken, officials said, and only an hour's supply was left when the dirigible landed last night.

Deposed Emperor Of China Leaves Peking

PEKING, Feb. 24.—(AP)—Hsuan Tung, the deposed emperor of China, has gone to Tientsin.

Hsuan Tung was forced to leave the imperial palace in the forbidden city early last November, after the capture of Peking by Feng Yu-Hsiang. Hsuan first went to the home of the former agent, Prince Shun, but later took refuge in the Japanese legation in Peking. This move was said at the time to have been made with the consent of other interested legations and on the advice of Hsuan's English tutor, who accompanied him.

HOLLYWOOD, Feb. 24.—Charlie Chaplin is a man of exceptional mind. He is a true artist. He is brilliant, and has the usual restless mind peculiar to genius.

Only one type of mate is suitable to such a man. One who is equal to him in brilliance, and also is possessed of a mind ever seeking the new in life, the high lights and the deep shadows.

Such a mind, naturally, is not found in one of immature years. I do not know the intimate circumstances of the Chaplins' present domestic life, but from my past knowledge of Chaplin I do not believe blame attaches to either of them.

It is just that he only can find his happiness in marriage with one of his own years, with a mind developed into the spheres in which he thinks and lives.

A horoscope cast for Mr. Chaplin some time ago said he would marry three times.

Undoubtedly, to my mind, this horoscope is sure of fulfillment. I do not say this because of my

belief in the supernatural, but because I feel that love plays a very important part in his life.

More so even than in the lives of most persons, as he always is searching for an ideal, for one who will be his complete dream, some true.

And he will have to find it in one older than I was, 17, when I married him.

Mr. Chaplin loves children. Indeed, very, very much.

It may be that the birth of a baby threatened breach between them. To the Chaplins would lead any threatened breach between the two.

But that is a matter more for conjecture than for prophecy.

All in all, if the Chaplins separate, I would judge it to be due merely to the fact that they were not real mates, probably neither to blame, but still recognizing that life apart would be better for each.

Otherwise the growing years would cause their realization that they are not happy together to grow.

My personal opinion is that in any case, certainly a child should be well provided for and a girl permitted sufficient to care for herself.

But no one should have everything taken away for which he has struggled for years.

NAVY IS ORGANIZED SOLELY TO FIGHT, SAYS MR. WILBUR

WASHINGTON, Feb. 24.—The American navy, like every other, is organized solely to fight, Secretary Wilbur said today in an address before the Women's Council on Defense as a Peace Insurance.

"It is organized for that purpose and for that purpose alone," continued the navy secretary. "We could and no doubt would scrap it and disband its personnel if we could be assured that there were to be no more wars and that there would never again be needed in world affairs."

"It should not be forgotten that the ultimate purpose of the navy is to enforce the will of the nation against those who oppose that will. It is the nation's pledge of its firm purpose to maintain its will against opposition."

"When we are ready to yield all things to the will of others; when property, life, liberty and religion mean less to us than the effort to maintain them, we may abandon the navy and submit to the authority and power of a more virile race."

"But even such servile and pusillanimous submission may not give the race such sacrifices are made to obtain. The ungrateful hands of millions of slaughtered Americans, men, women, and children ruthlessly butchered, warn us that there is not security in complete disarmament."

"The kingdom of heaven has not yet arrived on earth, no matter how much we have prayed for it, or how much more nearly it has approached. For a great wealthy nation like America, simply able to sustain its will for good and to sustain it and to protect its peaceful missionaries of righteousness everywhere and to advance justice and righteousness in the world—for such a nation to disarm and submit to pusillanimous incompetency to advocate or maintain justice would be a crime against God and man."

Sleeper Shoots Gun; is Killed

FRESNO, Cal., Feb. 24.—While in the throes of a nightmare, Amado Limon, employe of the Southern Pacific railroad at Mojave, twisted fitfully in his sleep, causing a revolver he had under his pillow to discharge, wounding him fatally in the abdomen.

The noise of the explosion, according to stories of the accident brought here, awakened companions who rushed Limon aboard a train for San Francisco. Limon expired just before the train reached Fresno. An inquest will be held.

Warned Repeatedly. The doctors have repeatedly urged Herr Ebert to take a long rest and seek a cure, but he has refused, as he felt that his official duties required his presence in Berlin.

The patient's temperature rose very high immediately after the operation, but toward 4 o'clock it came to 39 centigrade (102.2 Fahrenheit).

Frau Ebert went to the sanatorium to see her husband at 9 o'clock and about an hour afterward the announcement was made that his condition was satisfactory.

The socialist newspaper Vorwarts expressed uneasiness about possible unrest which President Ebert's illness may cause in the political situation and added:

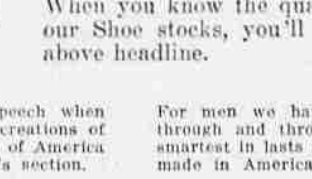
