

SCULPTOR READY TO FIGHT CASE OF STONE MOUNTAIN

NEW YORK, March 2.—Ready to "rot in jail," in defense of his ideals, Gutzon Borglum, sculptor, is preparing for "the fight of his life," in connection with the Stone Mountain Confederate memorial, which he says should be completed because it is the greatest project of the sort ever conceived.

He admitted last night on his return from Atlanta that he had destroyed his models and plans after his dismissal by the officials of the Stone Mountain memorial association. For this he had been arrested at Greensboro, N. C., on a warrant charging vandalism and malicious mischief.

"I destroyed the temporary models for the greatest piece of sculpture in the world's history," he said, "because I believed right of an artist to his own creation. I am ready to rot in jail rather than yield this principle. Let the small provincial minds of my enemies contemplate the work of stone cutters—or shoemakers, if they wish. I am ready for a fight."

"Why they are trying to crucify me! Think of their impudence! They fired me a fortnight after I had served notice on them that I intended to ask for an accounting of their stewardship of the association's funds. They are spending about as much for office overhead as I was on my staff working on the mountainside."

James Barton Will Be Legion Adjutant

DES MOINES, March 2.—James F. Barton of Des Moines announced today his acceptance of the position of national adjutant of the American legion.

The position was recently offered to Mr. Barton by National Commander James A. Harkin, as a successor to Russell G. Creviston of Indiana, who it is understood here, desires to relinquish the post so he can devote all of his time to the legion's child welfare endowment drive.

Mr. Barton, a former Fort Dodge, Iowa, resident, has been adjutant for the legion in Iowa for some time.

Prior to the war, he practiced as an attorney. He is expected to go to Indianapolis to assume his new duties about April 1.

Epicentral Point Of Quake Sought

NEW YORK, March 2.—Having virtually decided that Saturday night's earthquake originated in a sub-strata rock movement in the extreme north-eastern part of the United States or in eastern Canada, scientists are endeavoring to chart the epicentral point more exactly.

Some held that the tremors which shook a large area of the continent were caused by a slip of rock in a great fracture known as the Fundan Fault, which lies deep in the Atlantic's bed off the Maine coast.

Others placed the quake near the mouth of the Saguenay river in the Province of Quebec.

Clemency for Garvey Asked in Telegrams

WASHINGTON, March 2.—Telegrams from all parts of the United States and from Canada and Mexico came into the offices of The Associated Press here today, telling of mass meetings of negroes yesterday, seeking clemency for Marcus Garvey, who is under penitentiary sentence for conspiracy to defraud members of his race in an African colonization scheme.

The telegrams said a message had been sent to President Coolidge asking "clemency for our leader, Marcus Garvey."
