

POTATO MARKET REMAINS SLUGGISH

Movement Stagnant For Month and is Continuing In Same Manner

PORTLAND, Ore., March 2.—Just as the sluggish condition of coast potato markets is causing some anxiety among growers and dealers alike, the movement in the past month, during which prices advanced to \$1.50 to \$1.60 in the county for good Oregon Burbank King of the Hill potatoes is disappearing. Some have ascribed the lack of demand to heavy rains in sections of California that ordinarily use Oregon seed and others to a lack of ability of the southern growers to finance a coming crop.

It is a carefully prepared price chart, by R. Ringer, local representative of the bureau of agricultural economics, shows that the present slump is not abnormal and that the price rushed up a peak three weeks earlier than last year. There was practically no market for Oregon stock this year, at least for the first part of January.

Analysis of price fluctuations in the government chart shows that values were definitely established at \$1.25 per bushel by January 20th, while the competitive buying forced the market to \$2 by February 1st. Since then there has been no buying to speak of and the market has eased back to \$1.50 and \$1.60. Oregon shipments from February 1st to Feb. 7th were 20 as compared with 100 February 20 as compared with 300 cars shipped during the same period last year. Oregon has now shipped a total of 619 cars as compared to 832 cars up to the same time in 1924.

Potato holdings in the whole country on January 31st this year were 16,000,000 bushels larger than the year before. The situation is generally bearish.
