Re-Nomination of Charles Beecher is Returned to Senate

WASHINGTON, March 25.—President Coolidge today returned to the senate the re-nomination of Charles Beecher Warren, of Michigan, to be attorney general, which failed of confirmation at the session ending yesterday.

The nomination of Harry S. New of Indiana to succeed himself as postmaster general, also was sent to the senate.

The batch of nominations sent by the president did not include those of other cabinet members, however, and it was indicated that Mr. Coolidge had taken the position that they could continue in office under the new administration without another confirmation by the senate.

CASCADE PREPARES BIG TRAIL PROGRAM

Total mileage of secondary trails in the Cascade national forest when complete is estimated at 976 miles, according to Nelson F. Macduff, who has compiled comprehensive trail plans for the next several years.

The trails would be divided in the following groups: McKenzie bridge, 330 miles, estimated cost, \$68,200; Reserve, 204 miles, \$47,119; Oakridge, 442 miles, \$85,159.

Training School Measure may be Unconstitutional

SALEM, Ore., March 5.—There is a possibility that construction of a training school at Independence for the Monmouth normal school for which the legislature appropriated \$125,000, may be found unconstitutional.

The point was raised at a meeting of the state board of control today by State Treasurer Kay, who cited constitutional provision which prohibits the construction of state buildings anywhere outside of Marion county without a vote of the people.

Secretary Abrams of the board was instructed to get an opinion from Attorney General Van Winkle.

Should this appropriation be knocked out the Monmouth normal would be left almost without appropriation, as the governor vetoed the item providing for buildings and repairs at Monmouth.

DR. VAN WATERS GIVES ADDRESS AT OREGON ASSEMBLY

Dr. Miriam Van Waters, prominent child welfare worker and Oregon graduate of 1908, speaking on "Youth in Conflict," at the assembly in the Woman's building this morning, emphasized the need of a sound public policy in dealing with juvenile delinquents.

"The juvenile court is a social laboratory which reveals the breakdown of our institutions," explained Dr. Van Waters. "So many individuals who cannot adapt themselves pass through these institutions that we get a bird's eye view of the ills of society as a whole."

Home is basis "Discarding the popular theories that the offender is a special physical type, that feeble-mindedness altogether causes degeneracy, and that the broken home accounts for delinquency, we must go back to the relation of the home to the child," said Dr. Van Waters.

Dr. Van Waters, in conclusion, brought out the idea that "the great social forces of today are clear ideas in energetic men and women of good will."

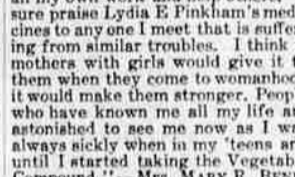
