

AMERICAN FLEETS READY TO ENGAGE IN PACIFIC 'WAR'

BOARD U. S. S. SEATTLE, AT SEA, OFF WEST COAST OF MEXICO, March 10.—(AP)—Monday, the great battle fleets, involving one hundred and nine vessels, of the United States and the Black fleet, were in the zone of possible combat in a great war game. The great Black fleet of 57 vessels, the main defense of which is the dreadnaughts, one cruiser, 29 destroyers, aircraft and mine sweepers, is a vastly superior enemy. There are eight of the new cruisers with the Blue fleet and one with the Black force. These cruisers are the fastest American war craft afloat, being capable of scouting 35 knots an hour.

SCULPTOR TO TRANSFORM PEAK

Next Job of Gutzon Borglum Will be in South Dakota. Where Lincoln and Washington Statues are to be Made

CLEVELAND, March 10.—The next great artistic task of Gutzon Borglum, famous sculptor, will be to convert a spire-like peak in the Black Hills of South Dakota into colossal statues of Washington and Lincoln.

Borglum, whose work on the Stone Mountain Confederate Memorial in Georgia came to an abrupt ending after a stormy dispute with the association in charge of it, will start work on the western memorial this summer.

Towering 600 feet above surrounding country, the statues of Washington and Lincoln will be visible for 50 miles. The figures will be 50 feet higher than the Washington monument.

The statues will be carved on Harney's Peak, about 40 miles from Rapid City, S. D. The cost of the memorial will be more than a million and a half dollars and will be paid for through funds raised by popular subscription and through sale of souvenir coins.

Russian Soviet's Public Education Funds Increasing

WASHINGTON, March 10.—Expenditures by the Russian soviet government this year for public education, amounting to between \$100,000,000 and \$150,000,000 will exceed by more than 120 per cent the outlay for that purpose in the fiscal year, 1923-24, according to a statement issued here today by the Russian information bureau.

The appropriations said to have been made possible by the remarkable economic improvement of the country in the past year, "are substantially larger" than the statement adds. The "pre-war expenditures for education under the czarist regime."

MRS. STOKES MAY BECOME WITNESS, JUDGE DECLARES

CHICAGO, March 10.—Judge W. N. Gemmill, presiding at the trial of W. E. B. Stokes, millionaire apartment hotel owner of New York and Robert F. Lee, Chicago negro, for conspiring to defame Mrs. Helen Ellwood Stokes, has ruled that Mrs. Stokes can take the witness stand, it was learned today.

The Illinois statute provides three special exceptions in the otherwise strict rule against a wife testifying against her husband, but Judge Gemmill held that the law was not clear as to Mrs. Stokes' right to testify in the present instance and suggested that the case offered an opportunity for a needed test.

Mrs. Stokes has stated that it was not her wish to testify against her husband, but rather to testify in defense of her good name assailed yesterday when John T. Burke, Chicago sleeping car conductor, testified that she was accompanied from Denver to Chicago by Hal Billig, her cousin, who for a part of the trip moved from his upper berth to the lower occupied by Mrs. Stokes.

The time of Mrs. Stokes' possible appearance on the witness stand, was not definitely fixed.
