DR. WISE GIVES ASSEMBLY TALK

That spiritual forces are the creative forces in the world is the belief of Dr. Jonah B. Wise, Rabbi of Temple Beth Israel, of Portland, who addressed the student assembly of the university Thursday morning on "Some Creative Forces and Their Evidence." They are spiritual forces in the sense of finer, higher motives, Dr. Wise says. Teachers in the university have one of the greatest spiritual opportunities of any group of people, even greater than that of ministers, because they have the student in the formative period of his life, he thinks. "The spiritual force that goes out from a university is a creative force," declared the speaker.

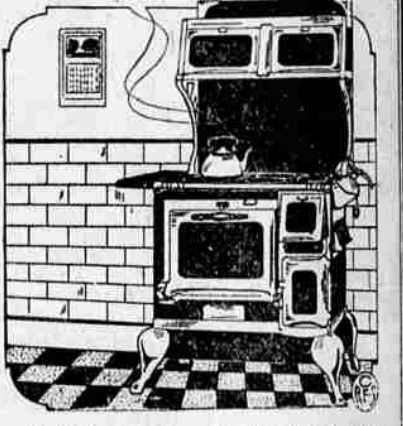
Automobile to be Given to Mrs. Page
