

LABOR MEETING IS CALLED AT SALEM

F. L. Armitage, superintendent of the United States employment office in Eugene, will attend a labor conference of representatives of employers and employees on Monday, it was announced today. The meeting has been called by H. H. Gram of Salem, state labor commissioner, and will be held in the state house.

The Salem assembly is one of a series of meetings to be held during the year which will be in the form of a conference house for employment of workers throughout the state, at which the various commercial and government officers will exchange views and experiences, and give a survey of the labor conditions in the various districts.

This is the first general labor meeting of the year, Mr. Armitage anticipates a large attendance, probably more than 100.

British Army for Next Two Years Shows Decrease

LONDON, March 12.—(P)—The British army estimates for 1925-26 show a reduction of 10,000 men, and a reduction for maintenance will total 12,000,000 pounds sterling, against 15,000,000 pounds last year.

In a memorandum accompanying the estimates, the secretary for war, Mr. Laming Worthington Evans, declared the recruiting last year was satisfactory and that more than half the applicants were rejected as not coming up to the high army standards of physique, education and character.

The production of light tanks in process, with new designs under construction and protective measures against air attacks are being improved.

Demonstration of Drainage Success

Thirty-five farmers were in attendance at the drainage demonstration held yesterday afternoon at the F. F. Hyde farm near Pleasant Hill, according to O. S. Fletcher, county agricultural agent. F. E. Price, about 10 drainage experts of the Oregon Agricultural college, conducted the demonstration. Mr. Price spoke last evening at a meeting of the Farmers Union of Pleasant Hill. All phases of the drainage system at the Hyde farm, which was installed under the direction of Mr. Price, were demonstrated to the farmers, Mr. Fletcher stated.

Lane Dogs may be Entered in Shows

Owners of dogs in this city are receiving invitations to make entries at the annual show of the Portland Kennel club which will be held April 2 to 4. George Kinnear, vice-president of the club, writes that about 50 entries are expected and points out that the open and novice classes will provide for many dog owners to exhibit that have not got pedigrees as entries in this class are not required to be registered. It is expected that several dogs from Lane county will be entered in the competition.

The ceremony took place in the Reichstag and the oath was administered by the Reichstag president, Herr Loebe.

STATE REPLIES IN SCHOOL LAW CASE

"The brief held. It asserted also that the opposition was 'devoted to arguments which related to the wisdom of and not the constitutionality of the law.'

Not a decision of the supreme court has been cited by the opposition to sustain its contention that the law is unconstitutional, the brief said.

The brief pays particular attention to the contention of private and parochial schools operating under charters that they have a property right which cannot be taken away.

Reply is Given.

It said in this particular: "The supreme court has laid down the doctrine, which it has not abandoned, that the obligation of the charter of a corporation was not impaired by any loss, however serious, which a corporation might suffer as the indirect result of the exercise of a proper governmental function by the state which chartered it.

"No person can claim protection of the federal constitution on the plea that he is being deprived of his property without due process of law because of any loss which may be suffered as an indirect result of exercise of a proper governmental function by a state regardless of how certain or how serious this loss may be."

Bolshevism "Absurd."

The city of Bolshevism that has been raised according to the belief, was held to be "absurd and unjustifiable."

The killing of Robert Frank, a Chicago school boy by two youths, Nathan Leopold and Richard Loeb, which was brought into the school controversy by the sisters as illustrating the need of religious and moral training, brought from the state the reply that the two culprits had been educated in private schools.

permission to the North Pacific Union conference of Seventh Day Adventists to file a brief as a friend of the court in the Oregon school case, with the consent of both sides. The adventists are conducting 33 church schools in the state, and have joined the Episcopal church, also appearing as a friend of the court, in attacking the law.

The churches contend that the new statute would deprive private schools of their natural rights, holding that parents have a common law right to direct the education of their children.

The Adventists asserted that Oregon had no right to abrogate the vested rights of private schools and could not dismiss the contractual rights of schools incorporated under the laws of the state. The school law was denounced as "the encroachment of misguided powers upon natural and inalienable rights."

Pine Beetle Control Work is Taken up

BEND, Ore., March 12.—A. J. Jaenicke, entomologist, with the Northwest district forestry office, arrived in Bend yesterday to begin work on a pine beetle control project in the Deschutes national forest.

The beetle infestation is said to effect a 25,000 acre area in the north end of the forest near Metolius and is the largest infested area in Oregon at the present time.

Springfield School Heads Re-Elected At Board Meeting

SPRINGFIELD, March 12.—(Special)—Vern D. Bain was re-elected principal of the Springfield high school at a meeting of the board of directors for district 19 in the city hall last evening. At the order of the board Mr. Bain's salary will be raised from \$2,000 a year to \$2,100. Mr. Bain came here last autumn from Adm, Wash., and has held the positions of both principal and athletic coach.

Mrs. Ora Road Hemenway, principal of the Lincoln grade school, was re-elected to serve a third year as principal at a salary of \$1,400 for nine months. Otto Hurcham, principal of the junior high school, was re-elected at a salary of \$150 a month for nine months. If he accepts the position it will be his third year as professor in the Springfield schools, and his second as principal.

Alfred J. Morgan was re-elected as head of the manual training department at the Springfield high school at a salary of \$1700 for nine months. Next year will be Mr. Morgan's fourth year in the schools.
