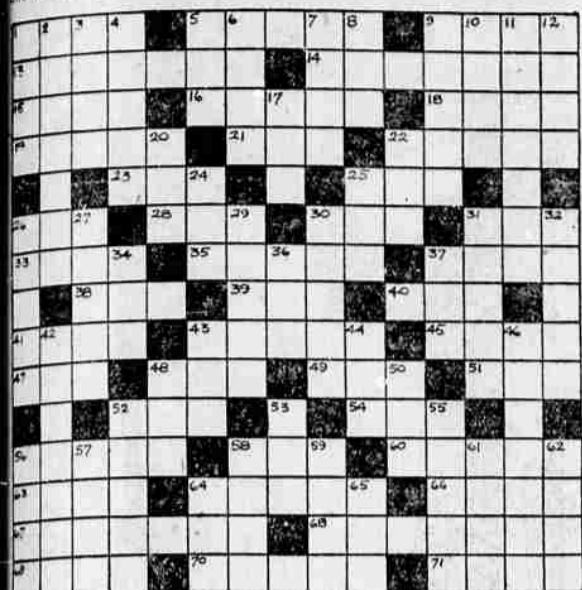


Today's Cross-Word Puzzle

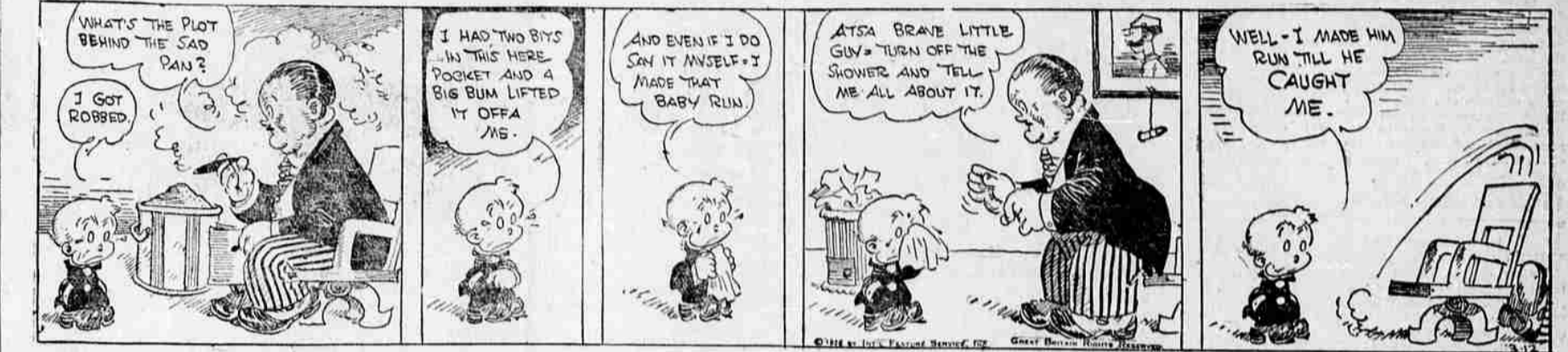

Home Hints

- IF A CLOSET is damp, place a cup of quicklime in the corner and it will absorb the dampness and disinfect as well.

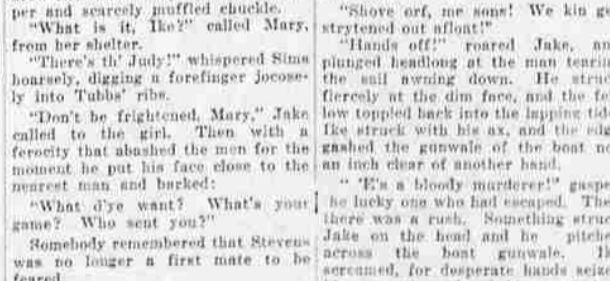
Radio Programs
