**Tax Penalty Given—**  
Penalties for failure to file income tax returns become effective at midnight, Monday, March 16, it was announced this morning from the office of James Furnish, deputy, in the city hall. Following are the penalties: "For willful failure to make and file a return on time—not more than \$10,000 or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both, and, in addition, 25 per cent of the amount of the tax. For willfully making a false or \$10,000 or imprisonment for not more than five years, or both, and, in addition, 50 per cent of the amount of the tax. For deficiency in tax, interest on deficiency at 6 per cent per year to the date the deficiency is assessed,

Astoria's total was \$106,730; Salem, \$154,550; and Portland, \$3,504,680. Portland's figure is the biggest monthly total in its history, and is 54 per cent higher than last February.

Other cities are watching to see what Eugene's building record is going to be this year, according to Mr. Alexander. 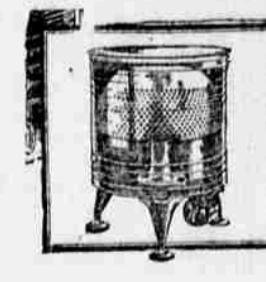
