

COTTER GETS YEAR FOR THEFT CHARGE

One year in the state penitentiary was the sentence received by Harold Cotter when he appeared before Judge G. F. Shipworth this morning. Cotter was convicted by a circuit court jury on charge of car theft.

Judge Shipworth this morning dismissed the appeal case of Charles Lee, Virgil Osburn, Charles Sheldon and Harry M. Zee. The four were recently convicted in justice court and appealed the case to the circuit court. Lee is serving six months, fine \$500; Osburn, four months, fine \$500; Sheldon, two months, fine \$500; Zee, four months, fine \$300.

E. E. Morgan who was found guilty by a circuit court jury last night on a charge of liquor sale will receive sentence Monday.

NEW RAIL WORK TO BE LAUNCHED SOON

All preparations have been made for the starting of the laying of steel from rail-head to McCredie next Monday, according to construction men of the Southern Pacific cut-off who were in the city today. A gang of 75 Mexicans will start work on the laying of steel and it is expected that construction will be rapid. Some indication of the confidence that the work will proceed at high speed is the fact that a wager has been made between some of the engineers in charge of the work that a speeder will be run over the new rails as far as McCredie by the first Sunday in April, which will give about three weeks time for the stretch of about five miles of track. It is reported. Ralls are at the terminus of the line and all other equipment ready for the operation, it is reported.

County Will Open Campaign on Dogs

In an effort to force Lane county dog owners to obtain licenses for the animals and also to determine the number of ownerless dogs that are said to be preying on sheep flocks, the county court will within the next week or 10 days put a dog catcher in the field, according to announcement today. The county has bills of \$600 for the past month for losses of sheep as the result of attacks by dogs. The sheep fund made up of the income of dog licenses is exhausted, the court states.

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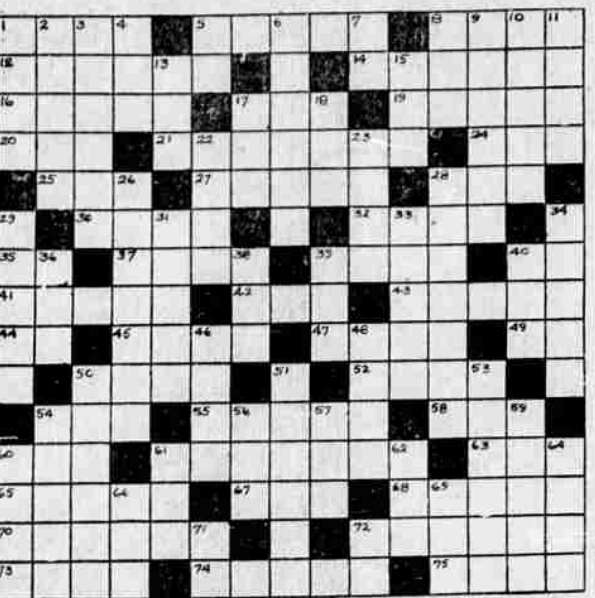

Orchards of Lane Damaged by Frost

Investigations in many Lane county orchards reveal that in several cases the low temperature of last December has harmed fruit trees although this damage is scattered and the loss is not confined to any one district nor is it extensive in any one orchard, according to C. E. Stewart, county fruit inspector.

"I have examined a number of fruit trees and find that in several cases the buds on the lower branches of the cherry trees are killed by the freeze. To a lesser extent the buds on walnuts, pears and peach are also hurt by the low temperature," Mr. Stewart said. This damage although harmful to some extent will in no way curtail the fruit crops as a

Only few Disease Cases on Reports

There are very few cases of contagious disease in Lane county at present, according to a report of Dr. S. M. Kerton, city and county health officer. The report since the first of the month shows two cases of meningitis; one of these having been reported the previous month; two cases of scarlet fever, one of diphtheria; and one of septic sore throat. Reports from other parts of the state received from the state health department show that Lane county has an excellent showing in the way of health conditions and freedom from contagion.
