COURT WILL CLOSE MONDAY FOR WEEK

Only one more case on the circuit court docket is scheduled for Monday and then court here will adjourn for a period of a week or 10 days. Judge G. F. Skipworth will go to Corvallis to hear cases in the Benton county court. The one civil case on the docket is that of Brodie against the Southern Pacific company.

Of the 15 criminal cases tried by John S. Medley, district attorney, since the present term of court opened, 13 convictions have been recorded. Six of the defendants pleaded guilty, seven were found guilty, one was acquitted, Nelson Beers, and one case ended in a hung jury, that of Leon R. Edmondson on an appeal from the justice court.

Two more jurors have been drawn for the circuit court panel to replace two that were excused. The new jurors are Hattie B. Drury, Springfield, and J. W. Cooley, Springfield.

Harold Willis Will Face Murder Charge In Juvenile Court

a murder charge in juvenile court here March 25, in connection with the killing of Dr. Benjamin Baldwin for which his mother, Margaret Willis, was sentenced to life imprisonment. Superior Judge Archibald made this decision today.

The boy's confession that he killed the doctor is characterized by the district attorney's office as a defense effort to save his mother from prison. The district attorney indicated today that at the hearing March 25, the judge will be asked to make Harold a ward of the juvenile court.

Harrisburg Bridge Work Progresses

HARRISBURG, March 14.—(Special)—The wooden cofferdam for the east bank pier of the Harrisburg bridge has been sunk to its timber's depth or about 20 feet and the dredging for same has been going right along, but before much more digging is done the steel piling that was driven about this pier last fall must be reclaimed. They will then be placed inside the wooden enclosure and sunk to the proper depth. The pile driving for the west side trestling is almost completed. This crew, it is reported, will soon begin dredging for the west pier but if material a river work may begin on the trestle decking and be continued until all danger of spring floods is past.

STATE ORATORICAL MEET IS WON BY STUDENT AT E. B. U.

J. Earl Ladd, representing Eugene Bible university, was awarded first place in the annual contest of the Intercollegiate Oratorical association of Oregon at Monmouth Friday evening. His oration, "Beyond the Fog," was a plea for Americans to rise above factional bickering and strife to face world responsibilities as a united people.

Representatives of nine Oregon colleges; Albany college, Eugene Bible university, Linfield college, Pacific college, Pacific university, Oregon Agricultural college, Oregon normal school, University of Oregon and Willamette university participated in the contest. Second place was awarded Willamette university while Pacific college won third.

neighborhood feud of over a year's standing may be aired. Hugh Geunzli, brother-in-law of Swartz, a little over a year ago was found dead in his barn, half a mile from the Swartz home. A bullet wound in the top of his head so located as to make suicide seem improbable caused private investigations to follow an inquest of the coroner's jury which found Keunzli died by his own hand. A man named Sharp, private investigator

from Spokane, after a long inquiry, declared before the county court here and in a letter to Governor Pierce, that Swartz, victim of today's tragedy, was responsible for the death of Keunzli.

While stating on the face of it that the killing of Swartz today was purely accidental, District Attorney Carlson said that investigations would be conducted at once as to the possibility of fuses having been changed on Swartz in his stump blowing operations.

torney today stated the death of Swartz will undoubtedly result in quashing the proceedings against Slaughter, in which Swartz was a vital witness in the case of prosecution.

Following this Swartz swore out a complaint, followed by an indictment by grand jury, charging another neighbor, George Slaughter, with involvement with Swartz's wife. This case is still pending and the district at-
