CHEYENNE, Wyo., March 18.—(AP)—Leading the defense in action in its side of the legal battle of Teapot Dome, Martin W. Littleton, noted New York attorney, expressed the gratitude of the Harry F. 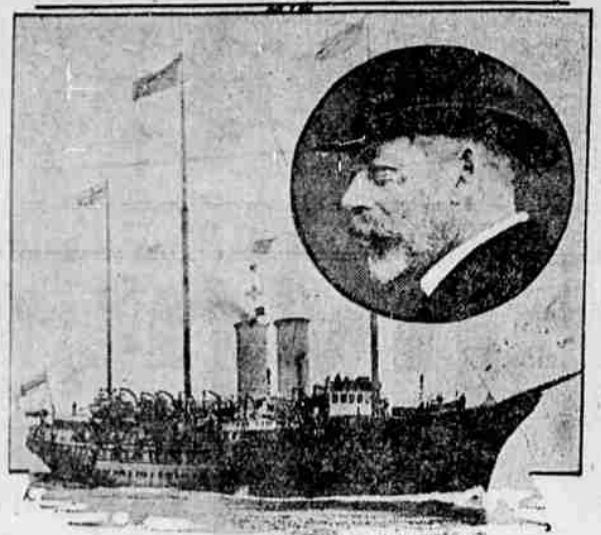

titled to the same share of the estate as if she had actually married him under a construction of the law by which she might be regarded as his equitable widow. They were ready to ask for a continuance when the petition of Shepherd to probate the will came up in probate court today.

Ten cousins of McClintock who have attacked the will on grounds that Shepherd used undue influence have announced through their attorneys that if their contention should be upheld, Miss Pope will receive the annuity for which the will provided.

Exhumation Planned. Exhumation of the bodies of Mrs. Emma Nelson McClintock, mother of the orphan and of Dr. Oscar Olson, brother of Judge Olson, who died suddenly after eating fruit brought by Shepherd when the physician was mildly indisposed, was planned by state's authorities.

In a statement last night, Judge Olson said he believed that his brother had been poisoned. He declared there had been a conspiracy of 10 years to obtain McClintock's estate, beginning before the death of Mrs. McClintock. He said his investigations would continue and findings of them would be turned over to the state's attorney.

INDICTMENT GIVEN

CHICAGO, March 18.—(AP)—The indictment of William Darling Shepherd and Charles C. Faiman for the murder of William Nelson McClintock contained 22 counts, each count placing the date of the poisoning as November 15, 1924, and the death as December 4, 1924. The following is a summary of the counts:

KING GEORGE TO LEAVE ON CRUISE

LONDON, March 18.—(AP)—King George leaves tomorrow on the southern trip prescribed by his physicians during his recent attack of bronchitis. Accompanied by Queen Mary he will leave for Dover, thence crossing to Calais, where the party will board the British royal train which is usually kept at Dunkirk in readiness for such occasions.

Arriving at Genoa on Friday they will embark on the royal yacht Victoria and Albert, which is already there under the escort of two British destroyers. The itinerary of the Mediterranean cruise has not been fully arranged, but probably will include visits to the islands of Malta and Minorca and it is stated that the king will witness the British naval maneuvers of the latter place.

Owing to King George's infrequent absences since his enthronement in 1910, the appointment of a special committee to care for the business of state while he is away has almost an air of novelty, and the newspapers print at length the quaint official announcement issued from the palace yesterday in antiquated, medieval phraseology.

"For divers causes and considerations," it said, "the king instructed his right and trusty and well beloved counsellors, Prince Henry, the Archbishop of Canterbury, Viscount Vane and Premier Baldwin to look after the safety and good government of the realm during his absence; empowering them to do anything that appears necessary and expedient to them except dissolve parliament or confer ranks and titles."

Such a commission has acted only once previously during the reign of the present sovereign—when he went to India, in 1911.

County Considers Streets Vacation

Petitions asking for the vacation of a number of streets and alleys in the town of Latham which were recently presented to the county court have not yet been acted on, according to announcement today. The petitions request that blocks 1 to 7 inclusive and all intersecting streets and alleys with the exception of the Pacific highway be vacated by county order. The questioned legality of the order has held up the action of the court. The property included in the petition request is on the west side of the Pacific highway.
