

### SMALL TOWN LIKED BY OTIS SKINNER

With the play over, with a little more than four blocks to go to his hotel, and five minutes to spare to be taken up enroute to the hotel (Otis Skinner thought, perhaps, that he had time to talk, on what he did not know.

And yet, quite as congenial and genial as Sancho Panza himself, Mr. Skinner found a number of things on which to comment. But he made it clear that he wanted to be asked questions.

When requested to tell something of his professional debut way back in the twenties in Philadelphia, he has- tily remarked, "A thousands years ago, a thousands years ago—a long time to remember, don't you think."

Someone in the party thought to ask him to tell of the most memora- ble, or exciting time in his career.

"The most memorable time in my career? When I got married!"

"But in your theatrical career?"

"That was theatrical!"

By the time the corner at the court house had been reached, and Mr. Skinner ever observing of everything about him, stopped in front of the fountain memorial dedicated to the veterans of the wars of the Philis- tines by the citizens of Eugene, flanking his case up and down the list of names he found the name Otis Drew.

"There's my name." "Then he thoughtfully drawled, "Otis drew— well, I hope he did!"

And that was a key to asking him how he regarded a college audience in comparison with the more sophisticated one of the more metropolitan cit- ies.

"Oh, the audience in a college town, or in a town the size of Eugene is greatly appreciative. They are keen. There is a piquancy about them that is pleasing."

"New York is ghastly, dead. I call it the 'deathwatch'."

By this time the hotel was reach- ed, and in the comfort of a chair Mr. Skinner settled back to strike at the critics of New York.

"The critics of New York are mere-

ly phrase makers, users of good Eng- lish. They are afraid to let loose of themselves, because they're afraid of criticism from other critics. They have to regard every play and pro- duction beneath any praise!"

He humorously remarked, however, that it was not a pleasant thing to be criticised, but that the audiences were seldom affected by the babble of the critics.

To conclude his talk for the eve- ning Mr. Skinner discussed what makes a play successful, and replied to his own question, "The psychology of the play is its success."

"But why have you stuck to your profession these many years," he was asked, in the hopes he would give some enlightenment on the tumor that he is soon to retire.

He quoted an old friend and direct- or by saying, "If I thought every- thing I produced would be a success I should quit." And that is just the rea- son—the uncertainty is the attraction. And now, that is all the time I have."

### 'SANCHO PANZA' PLEASES EUGENE

Fairly scintillating with sparkly bits of good humor and clever act- ing, "Sancho Panza," presented at the Heilig theater last evening with this Skinner as the lead was indeed the outstanding theatrical production of the year. Seldom has a star re- ceived the ovation here that Mr. Skin- ner did last evening.

The theme of the play based on cer- tain episodes in Cervantes' story, "Don Quixote," and taking place en- tirely in Spain during the reign of Philip II was totally different from anything seen in Eugene for a long time. But it took well, and criticism is in minus quantity.

The costumes were lovely, a gorge- ous display of brilliant colors and quaint designs.

The play was a satire on govern- ment, a satire on life, a satire on customs, and as such it was a success.

Otis Skinner was delightful in his role of Sancho Panza. His imperson- ation of the goatherd who became a governor and who cared little for the pomp and ceremony of court life, but who cared a great deal for freedom in giving justice to his subjects was excellent.

And the donkey, Dapple, in reality Robert Rosary, was one of the cleav- est characters of the cast, and kept the audience continually chuckling because of his antics.

Sancho and Dapple were not only the outstanding characters in the play but in reality also.

The prologue and the first three acts were well done and bubbled over with the wit and good acting, and for that matter the fourth act was good as far as the characters went, but it was rather superfluous, and some-

what destroyed the theme of the play and in a way dampened the pitch of enthusiasm which the audience had attained at the end of the third.
