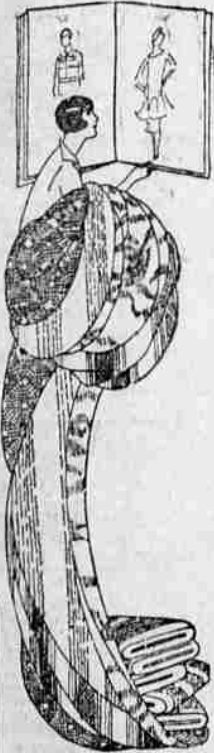

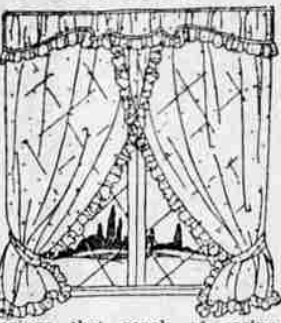

PORTLAND TO HAVE
ARTISTS' CONTEST

Any Eugene boys and girls expecting to enter the Young Artists' contest for the state of Oregon, to be held in the Portland Women's club Saturday evening, March 28, should file their applications by telephone, announces Mrs. Walter E. Bliss, 725 Multnomah street, Portland. It is expected that this city will be represented by at least one or more contestants.

Contestants must be citizens of the United States, and must have received all their training in the United States. Ages for voice contestants is from 20 to 30, and violin, 18 to 30.

The winner of this contest is eligible to compete in the Pacific district contest, comprising Oregon, Washington, Arizona and California. Winners in the district contest compete in the national contest in Portland during the national convention of the National Federated Music clubs in Eugene. The national winners will receive \$500 in cash or one year scholarship in a nationally known conservatory. The state contest is open to the public.

The annual dinner and dance, at which more than 300 persons will be present, will be next Wednesday evening, Fred Chess announced. Music by the high school orchestra, girls' quartet, boys' quartet, a monologue and a musical stunt by Mrs. Rose Stacks and Mrs. Donald Young will complete the program.

Egg Prices Higher
In Eugene Market

Eggs in Eugene will be higher in price for the coming season than for several years past, in the opinion of several local commission dealers, who report that a price of 25 cents a dozen is now being paid to farmers. This is five to six cents higher per dozen than that paid last year and unless there is an increased supply for the local market it is expected to remain at that figure, the dealers state. Present indications are that there will be no carload lots of eggs shipped to the Easter market this year as the majority of Lane shipments are going to Portland. During the past few years several large carload shipments have been sent out from Lane to the east.
