

# JAZZ SLAYER 17; BIRTHDAY SPENT FACING HEARERS

SAN FRANCISCO, April 1.—(AP)—Dorothy Ellingsen, who confessed that she killed her mother last January in a quarrel over the daughter's conduct, observed her seventeenth birthday today in custody on the charge of murder, which has been held in abeyance pending a determination of her present sanity. Her program for the day included a rest in the morning and a court session in the afternoon, when her attorneys had prepared to produce testimony in support of their contention that she is insane.

A jury to decide the issue of sanity was empaneled last night but Judge Lombard adjourned court until this afternoon, because the defense said it would not be ready to proceed until then.

The prosecution last night denied that it had obtained a signed statement from the young defendant in which she said she was sane and wanted to plead guilty of a charge of having killed her mother with a full realization of the seriousness of this admission.

The defense was just emphatically positive in denying the truth of vague reports that their client had repudiated her attorneys and consented them for their alleged failure to consult her before demanding her trial on a charge of insanity.

# ANNOUNCEMENT EXPECTED

DETROIT, April 1.—(AP)—Negotiations for the sale of Dodge Brothers, Inc., to a buyer or group of buyers whose identity has not been learned, are in progress here and an announcement may be expected late today. A. C. Schwartz, local representative of Dillon, Read and company, New York banking firm, told newspaper men.

One rumor was spoken today when Alvan MacAuley, president of the Packard Motor Car company, denied that his company was involved in any merger with the Hudson Motor Car company and the Briggs Body corporation for the purchase of Dodge Brothers, Inc.

The Goodyear Tire and Rubber company was named in another rumor current today as being the firm for which Dillon, Read and company is acting. Confirmation of this and other rumors was lacking.

# PRUNE BREAD TEST OF LANE ATTRACTS

Much interest in the prune bread baking contest to be held by the boys and girls clubs of Lane at the county fair this year has been manifested and several inquiries have been received as to the recipe for the bread, reports Arnold Collier, county club leader.

The following data on the prune bread were announced today by Mr. Collier the receipt being received from the Oregon Agricultural college extension division:

**Prune Bread Recipe.**  
 1 quart liquid (milk or water)  
 4 tablespoons melted shortening  
 1 or 2 cakes compressed yeast  
 4 teaspoons salt  
 About 3 quarts sifted bread flour  
 4 tablespoons sugar  
 1 pound prunes

**Method is Given**  
 Wash the prunes carefully and soak overnight in enough cold water to cover. Pit and cut up a little.  
 Soak the milk. Pour it into the mixing bowl, reserving 2-3 c to soak yeast in.  
 Add the sugar, salt and melted fat to the milk in the bowl. When lukewarm, (80 deg F.) add about half the flour.  
 When the milk in the cup is lukewarm, break in the yeast and add 1 t. sugar.  
 Add yeast to batter. Beat well, add enough more flour so the dough may be put out on the board and kneaded. Knead for about 20 minutes, adding the prunes and more flour from time to time. The dough should feel springy and free from stickiness when it has been kneaded enough.  
 Put the dough in the greased mixing bowl, grease the top of the dough to keep it from crossing over. Cover the

bowl with a clean cloth and set the bowl where it will keep warm.

When the dough has doubled in bulk knead it down again and let raise a second time until double in bulk. Form into loaves, let raise until nearly double in bulk and bake from 45 minutes to one hour depending on the size of the loaf.
